Schenectady reached the final by defeating Thornhill, Ont., skipped by Frank Kent, 9—6. Hamilton won its semi-final last night from the Nutmeg C. C. No. 1 rink of Darien, Conn.

The New York Caledonian Curling Club No. 2 rink, headed by Edwin L. Sibert, won twice in the first consolation event to take the St. Andrew's bowl, and Harry Coronis skipped the Nashua (N. H.) C. C. to the mixed curlers trophy in the second consolation event.
