## SIGNALS

There has been some confusion in our Club as to which turn a skip is asking for. The lack of uniformity in the use of arm signals has made it especially difficult for the new curlers to understand what turn his skip wants. To shed a ray of Fight on what is proper, your Editor interviewed our Club President and the Chairman of our Curling Committee and can now report with confidence that the following signals should be used to indicate turns.

In-turn. - The skip extends his right arm horizontally pointing to his right (player's left).

Out-turn. - The skip extends his left arm horizontally pointing to his left (player's right).

## RULES FOR THE JUG OGDEN JUG

The Jug Ogden competition is designed primarily for junior Skips and other curlers who normally play lead or number two position on the rink.

Matches to be ten ends.

Only those who neither skip nor play #3 regularly in their club competitions are èligible to skip and play #3 in this competition.

Due to the tight time schedule for these matches, the following penalty must be enforced:

> One stone and one end for each 15 minutes, or fraction thereof that a rink is late in appearing for a match.

No penalty for substitutions.

Regular skips and #3's when substituting must keep out of the house and refrain from advising the skip.

#2's shall record the score of the match in the rink book and record the win or loss on the score sheet in the club house.

\* These players should be invited to play only after other members not so designated have been given first opportunity.
