OPENING DINNER

The date for this happy occasion is set for Wednesday, November 6, 1963 at the Ardsley Country Club. In about two weeks you will receive a card on which you may indicate whether you will be on hand for this beverage and food festival.

MEMBERS MEETING

Don't forget the date - October 30, at President Hager's home.

CURLING

A meeting of the top brass of the members of W.C.A. was held at St. Andrew's on the evening of October 9, at which curling arrangements, a master schedule and other matters of importance were agreed upon. The contract with St. Andrew's for ice is the same as that of last year. The curling schedule, as approved, has active competition starting with Wilds matches on Sunday, November 10. Three Ardsley rinks will go into action on that day, one each at 9:45, 12:15, 2:45. The week end of November 16-17 will see seven Ardsley rinks on the ice, four on Saturday and three on Sunday.

The last scheduled matches are set for the week end of March 14 and 15.

St. Andrew's representatives showed off some of the new equipment they have provided for this year's curling and reported on other improvements, as follows:

1. A new measuring device for disputed stones. This will eliminate the old tape procedure and is far more accurate. It consists of a rigid bar which is anchored by a pin in the tee. A sliding adjustable scale is snugged up to one of the two stones in dispute and the number indicated on the top of the swinging caliper is read. The caliper is then locked in position with a thumb-set screw. The whole apparatus is then swung over for application to the second stone. The stone with the higher digit recorded on the indicator is the lying stone.

2. A new measure to determine whether stones have a "bite". This consists of a rigid bar, anchored in the tee, which is exactly measured to the outer rim of the blue. No contact - no bite! It should save tempers, time and bloodshed!

3. An improved measure for marking out the house and eliminating blurring or bleeding at the edges, which will now, it is claimed, remain sharp and clearly defined.

4. A new device (described but not displayed) for tightening the handles on stones. It sounds like a carpenter's maul or bungstarter. It was suggested that it include a warning "Defense de user pour hit le skip".

5. New headers have been installed. The brine pipes have been blown out and several sections replaced, the condensing equipment has been thoroughly overhauled and the timing adjusted. Roger says the ice will be colder by several degrees (down from 28° to 25°) and firmer.

BAR

No change in the arrangements enjoyed last year. We will have the bar and locker room available for our Tuesday curling. Buzz Burroughs urged the Presidents of all the clubs to ask their members to vacate the premises by 11 P.M. He was promised co-operation.

OPENING LUNCHEON

St. Andrew's Club is the place, 12:30 P.M. on Saturday, November 9 is the time, followed by practice, pickup games and you name it on the ice.

SPECIAL DATES

The St. Andrew's vs. Ardsley set of nine matches, on Washington's Birthday, falls on a Saturday in 1964.

Play-down for the District Medal has been scheduled for the week end of December 7-8.

EIGHTH ANNUAL U. S. MEN'S

These championship matches will be held this year at Utica, New York, and be sponsored by the Utica Curling Club. This is a "first" for these matches at a Grand National city. The matches will be played in the Utica Memorial Auditorium from March 2 to March 7, 1964. There will be no admission charge. A handsome souvenir program is planned. All clubs are urged to purchase an ad in this program. In addition, the sponsoring club has announced a Patron Page, on which will be listed the name of the patron and the name of his club. The listing can include Mr. & Mrs. and the contribution is \$10. Each person will receive a copy of the Souvenir Program, a 52 page job which will cover

all phases of the championship, the location of member clubs, the rules of curling and many other interesting details, the size 8½ x 11.

MOVIES

An announcement was made at the W.C.A. meeting that films of the International Matches in Scotland and the 1963 MacDonald Briar will be shown at St. Andrew's on the evening of Friday, November 8 and after the luncheon on the 9. There is a possibility that they will be available for our dinner on the 6.

MEMBERSHIP

It now appears that there will be five (5) openings for new members, and Dick Wells, Membership Chairman, reports four (4) applications. Deadline is October 15, so get busy if you have any one in mind.

ARDSLEY CURLING CLUB

Report of the Membership Committee

October 18, 1963

The annual membership meeting of the Ardsley Curling Club held in 1961 limited the size of the Club to 48 active curlers, pending progress on the matter of securing a new rink. This size for the active membership was reaffirmed last year. While this year's membership meeting may wish to reconsider the question of size, your committee in preparing this report has proceeded on the assumption that there has not been sufficient progress on the new rink project to justify increasing the active list beyond 48.

At the present time 42 curlers from the active list at the end of last year have signified their intention to curl as regular members on a full-time basis. Roger Lueck and Fred Parker have retired from the active list. Harold Sothern and Bob Samuel have asked to be placed temporarily on the associate list. Bob Reed wishes to retain active status but says that he will be unavailable so much of the time that he feels it unfair to deprive a potential new curler of a place on the active list. Bob has requested that he be permitted to maintain regular status and is prepared to pay the dues of an active member. He has suggested, however, that he not be regularly assigned to rinks for Blanton, Windeler, and Wilds competitions. When in town, he would appreciate being invited to play as substitute. Dunc Sutphen has indicated that his situation is somewhat similar to Bob's with respect to availability. If Bob Reed is placed in the active but reserve status, Dunc should be treated in the same way if he desires.

It is the recommendation of the Membership Committee that the Club elect sufficient new members from the candidates listed below to raise the number of "active and ready" curlers to 48. The Curling Committee will thus be in a position to proceed with roster assignments on that basis. Over the years experience has shown breakdown of the membership into eight units of six men each to be the most satisfactory. The Membership Committee recommends that, if they so desire, Messrs. Reed and Sutphen be continued as active members with the understanding that they will not be included on the rosters selected by the Curling Committee for intraclub competition but will be considered as reserves and when available will be offered opportunities to curl as substitutes.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the membership, there will be six positions to be filled. Regardless of the action taken by the membership with respect to the foregoing recommendations, we should establish at the October 30th meeting by preferential ballot the rating of the candidates and the order in which they will be selected to fill available openings.

At the deadline of October 15th, the Membership Committee had received nominations of the following persons for membership in the Club:

The Membership Committee has reviewed these nominations and has found them to be in order. The Secretary has already given notice of the meeting of the active membership of the Club for Wednesday, October 30th, for the purpose of voting upon these candidates.

The rules of the Club require that each active member be given an opportunity to vote on proposed new members either in person or by proxy or by submitting an absentee ballot. It is highly desirable that, if at all possible, you attend this important meeting so that you can hear the candidates discussed by their sponsors. However, in case you are unable to attend the meeting, we have enclosed a form of ballot for you to use as an absentee ballot or to submit through your proxy.

PLEASE NOTE that the instructions on the ballot for voting must be followed precisely for your ballot to be counted. If you cannot be present at the meeting, please mark your ballot in accordance with the instructions. You may mail or deliver it as an absentee ballot to the Chairman of the Membership Committee for receipt before the meeting or you may give it to your proxy to deliver at the meeting.

If the ballot is mailed or delivered as an absentee ballot, it must either be signed or accompanied by a transmittal letter identifying the member casting it. If the ballot is delivered by proxy, it must be accompanied by a form of proxy signed by the member appointing the proxy. Verbal proxies cannot be accepted.

ARDSLEY CURLING CLUB - MINUTES OF FALL ORGANIZATION
MEETING - OCTOBER 30, 1963

The annual fall organization meeting of the Ardsley Curling Club was called to order at the home of the President, on October 30, 1963, at 8:20 P.M. Virgil D. Hager, President, presided and W. P. Rogan, Secretary, acted as secretary of the meeting.

On motion of K. Stevenson, seconded by E. Doonan, the minutes of the meeting of October 30, 1962 were approved without reading.

L. Graaskamp, the Treasurer, delivered his report, which was approved and ordered filed. The Treasurer noted that dues, allocated the same as for the 1962-63 season, would be the same for this year as were charged for that season. Discussion ensued as to the procedure to be followed in the cases, if any, of non-paying associate members.

Approval was given to a proposal that they be notified by the Secretary, that unless they brought themselves up to date with the Treasurer's office, their names would be stricken from the Associate list and mailings to them discontinued. The Secretary was ordered to separate the "Honorary" and reciprocal club listings from our own Associate listings.

R. Wells delivered the report of the Membership Committee and stated (1) that active members R. Reed and D. Sutphen were willing to retain full active status, but requested that their names be not used by the Curling Committee in the formation of active rinks for competition; (2) that on this basis five (5) new members could be elected at this

meeting, bringing the total of available active curlers up to 48;
(3) that he recommended the membership be increased to 50, with Messrs. Reed and Sutphen on a "reserve" basis, to be called on by Skips whose regular team members might not be available to form a complete rink. On his motion, seconded by A. Kemp, the membership was increased to 50 on this plan, for this curling season. Mr. Wells then stated that seven (7) candidates have been proposed as reported by his Committee in a report mailed to all members. Sponsors for each of these candidates then spoke in support of their respective candidates. Messrs. J. Ringland and D. Stevenson were duly appointed by the President to assist Chairman Wells in tallying the votes. Written ballots were distributed, marked and collected, and the Chairman and tellers retired to count the ballots.

The President directed the Secretary to read to the members a letter from the Utica Curling Club, dated October 2, 1963, concerning the financial support of the Eighth Annual United States Men's Curling Championships to be held at Utica, with Utica Curling as the host club, in March 1964. After discussion, on motion by E. Doonan, seconded by E. Sibert it was voted that this Club take a full page ad in the program for the fee of \$200. The Secretary was ordered to communicate this result to Utica Curling and arrange for the copy of the ad. In addition the Secretary was directed to secure a sufficient number of application blanks for sponsor insertions by individual members of this Club to enclose a blank in the mailing of a future issue of Duck Soup, each member to follow his own wishes as to participation in this additional support.

Mr. M. Griggs reported that his Committee, charged with designing a new Ardsley Medal, had reached agreement, Approval was given

to the design agreed to by said Committee "sight unseen". The President appointed a committee consisting of A. Thorndike, Chairman, V. Hager, and B. Wood to design a new pin for the Windeler.

The President announced that our Treasurer, A. Graaskamp, was treasurer this year, for the W.C.A.

C. Stewart, President of Ardsley Country Club reported on the current status of the plans of that Club with respect to new club house facilities and their locations.

A. Thorndike, a member of the Curling Committee, advised that Blanton and Wilds rinks would be reported this week. He outlined a plan for using Wilds competition for play-down matches in connection with District medal play, with emphasis on intra-club play, in which co-skips may play without regard to fixed plan of rotation.

Mr. Wells then reported the results of the balloting. He announced that Messrs. W. Gorrisen, F. Herlitz, R. Irons, D. Lackey and W. B. May had been elected to the membership and that there was no waiting list. The Secretary was directed to advise the new members of their election, to invite them to the dinner on November 6 and to inform them of arrangements for instruction by the Curling Committee for November 12, 1963.

The Secretary reported that there were on hand twenty-three (23) acceptances and ten (10) regrets for the Opening Dinner on Wednesday, Nov. 6, at Ardsley Country Club.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion duly adopted the meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M.

MEMORANDUM FROM THE CURLING COMMITTEE

This year, for the first time, the United States Men's Curling Championship will be held in the territory of the Grand National at Utica, New York. Because the event will be so close to home, there may well be more local interest than usual. Ardsley hopes to field a rink which will have a good chance, in competition with other New York clubs, to win the right to represent New York State in the Championship. The play-down for the southern section of the state is scheduled for the middle of January. The decision as to the make-up of that rink will be made by the Curling Committee which will be guided by developments during the next two months.

The Curling Committee expects to give considerable weight to individual performance in the Wilds competition, particularly in the matches between Ardsley rinks. The District Championship matches in early December may also provide a guide through keen competition for the Ardsley representatives in that event. Of course, the skip chosen to lead the Ardsley forces in the New York State play-down will have a substantial say in the selection of his rink.

Because the Wilds competition will this year see Ardsley co-skips curling together, it is likely that some curlers will get less opportunity than usual to curl in that competition. However, the Curling Committee hopes to balance things off in the Jug Ogden competition which commences early next year. In any event, it is hoped that the special significance of this year will be recognized by our membership as an extenuating circumstance.

Note: For this year only, the co-skips may curl together. Although it is hoped that the skips will divide the assignments among their personnel on an equitable basis, it is expected that they will attempt to field strong rinks whenever they face another Ardsley rink.

THE WILDS COMPETITION

RULES GOVERNING PLAY IN THE INTER-CLUB MATCHES

1963 - 1964

1. Games shall be played according to schedule. There can be no arrangements, even by mutual consent, for play of cancelled games.
2. The Sponsor Club identification of the Rinks entered in these competitions, together with the names of the Skips, and all members assigned to the various Rinks, shall be filed with the St. Andrew's Curling Committee.
- Changes in the designated team positions are permissible.
4. Not more than TWO substitutes are permitted in any one game. If only one substitute is used, that substitute must play LEAD. If two substitutes are used they must play LEAD and NUMBER TWO respectively. A Rink shall be considered to have defaulted if it has less than three members, including a substitute, available for play at the scheduled time.
5. A Rink will be penalized ONE point and ONE end if not on the ice and ready to play within 10 minutes of the time scheduled. An additional point and end will be added to the penalty for each succeeding 5 minutes tardiness. If both Rinks are not on the ice and ready to play within 10 minutes of the time scheduled, the game shall consist of NINE ends and shall be reduced ONE end for each succeeding 10 minutes of tardiness.
- (NOTE: These penalties are imposed by the Curling Committee and MAY NOT BE WAIVED by mutual consent of the Skips.)
6. The Rink winning the greatest number of games will receive SIX Medals. In the event of a tie between two or more Rinks, the Curling Committee shall decide the details of the "Play-off".
7. Each game to consist of 10 ends, except as set forth in Rule 5.
8. North American Curling Rules shall govern where these rules are not specifically applicable.

THE BLANTON COMPETITION

RULES OF PLAY

1963 - 1964

1. All matches will be 10 ends.
2. All matches must start by 8:00 p.m.
3. All rinks will play all other listed rinks according to the prescribed schedule. The rink that wins the most matches will win the gold medal. The runner-up rink will win the silver medal.
4. Due to the tight schedule and scarcity of uncommitted ice, should there be a tie for either Blanton medal, the winner (or winners) will be that rink which has garnered the greatest number of net points over the period of the competition (loss points subtracted from win points), so be sure and play out all matches to at least a 10 end conclusion and correctly list total win and loss points in the rink book for the entire match. A tie at the end of 10 ends shall require an extra end playoff.
5. A rink will be penalized 1 stone if all 4 players are not on the ice and ready to play within 10 minutes of the official starting time. The penalty for curling with only three men on a rink is one stone. With only three men on a rink, the player acting as lead must play 4 stones.
6. Curlers used as substitutes who rate a penalty of two stones include: Wells, Hastings, Hockmeyer, Thorndike, Stewart, Wood, Sibert and Nolan. All other substitutes rate a penalty of one stone.
7. Arrange rinks if possible so each member curls an equal number of times.
