
WINDELER RULES

1964

- 1. Because of a tight ice schedule this year, it may be impossible to play off ties in that event the edge in net plus (or where applicable, perish the thought, minus) stones will determine the order of finish of rinks. The Committee does hope, however, to arrange a playoff where a tie is involved.
- 2. Each substitute, to a maximum of two per rink, shall cost a one-stone penalty except for the following who shall each cost a two-stone penalty: Hastings, Sibert, Nolan, Thorndike, Hockmeyer, Stewart, Colgan, Kemp, Wells, Wood, McCormack, Ringland and James.
- 3. The Blanton rules shall apply generally except as modified above.
- 4. Dictatorial decisions in areas of doubt and contest are the Committee's prerogative and to be presumed.


