Dear Member:

The Season is fast approaching. Our curling chairmen are beginning to stir and want to know what they have to work with. They ask that you complete and return the enclosed Curling Information form promptly. A return envelope is also enclosed.

I won't belabor our need for new members. I am sure everyone is aware that this is a serious problem and that the continued success of the Club depends upon good progress in solving it. To date George Bollenbacher, our Membership Chairman, has received the names of only 2 prospects. This is very disappointing, and we have accordingly cancelled the new member cocktail party planned for October 5. It behooves every member to search out prospects within the next month and bring them to our Open House. The Open House will be on Saturday, October 25, from 2 to 6 at the Curling Club. But even if you don't have a prospect, it is important that you come to the Open House to liven it up and to support those who do have prospects.

Ray Turnball will be conducting his T.U. Curling School on the weekend of November 14 - 16 at St. Andrew's. It will consist of three $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 hour sessions and costs \$50. If you are interested, complete the enclosed form and forward it to Steve Mojo by October 1. He will let you know by November 1 when your classes are scheduled.

For any men curlers who don't think they need to go to the Curling School, there is something else they can do on that weekend. The Ross Tarlton Shield Bonspiel will be held on November 14 and 15 in Kingston, Ontario. This is similar to the Gordon International in that it is played between an equal number (in this case 12) of Grand National and Canadian rinks, and its venue alternates between Canada and the U.S. Let me know if you are interested.

The following statement of our operations over the past two years shows that we are in the best cash position we have been in for a number of years. I am, however, concerned by the substantial increase in our expenses, led by electricity and oil.
