As soon as all plans are complete we will provide more information. SAVE THE DATE AND PLAN ON BRINGING PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS. It's a good time and place to introduce them to the social side of the game.

CLEAN-UP DAY---Burns Patterson will be in touch with the committee chairmen for NY Caledonians and St. Andrew's who in turn will call their members to help out with a general sprucing up of the clubhouse and the grounds. We ask that you cooperate if possible.

OPEN HOUSE---Saturday and Sunday October 22nd and 23rd. This year the three clubs will run a joint open house so that members will be able to invite their guests to attend at any time during both days rather than being limited to a few specific hours on one day. We hope that this will make it easier for you to get your friends down to the club. Each club will have representatives

there at all times the program is open so that your guests will

be able to sign up with the club of their choice.

Although St. Andrew's has not officially designated a chairman as of this date, Gert Messing will either be able to help you or steer you in the right direction. His telephone numbers are (Home # 914-961-7252 and business 718-497-0802).

It is imperative that we increase our membership if we are not to be burdened with ever increasing dues. Each year we loose a

few members due to retirement or job relocation.

Until a few years ago the Ardsley curlers were able to stay about even by attracting enough new members to balance the loss of old members. Unfortunately this has not been the case in the past few years.

Although I do not have specific figures for the other two clubs I suspect that over the long term their situation has been about the same and that they have fewer members now than they had several years ago. Mahopac, of course, has completely disappeared

from the scene.

The sad fact is, that even with the combined clubs curling under one roof, our costs of doing business have increased to the point that the Board of Directors have approved a 10% increase in dues for all classes of membership for the 1988/89 season.

The primary cause for the increased expenses are the annual rent we pay to the Ardsley Country Club under the terms of the new five year lease and the fact that all bar revenues, under the terms of the agreement with the Country Club, must now be held in escrow to satisfy our bonded indebtedness. In previous years bar revenues were used to help defray operating expenses. When the bonds are satisfied we hope that these revenues will again be available for use by the Curling Club but that is quite a few years off.

It is important this year that we make every effort to

increase our membership. Staying even is not enough.

Please don't sit back and feel that your committees are going to solve this problem for us. It will take the combined effort of every single one of us to insure that there is still curling in Westchester in the years ahead. Take a look around your neighborhood and your office and see if you can't find some nice friendly people looking for something to do this winter.

T-U CURLING SCHOOL --- Ray Turnbull, who is known to many of us who have curled more than just a few years, is returning to Ardsley The dates curling instructors. with his year this Friday/Saturday/Sunday, November 4/5/6. The tentative schedule is for two class on Friday (6:00PM to 8:00PM and 8:30PM to 10:30PM), two classes on Saturday(9:00AM to 12:00 noon) and (1:00PM to 4:00PM), and three on Sunday (9:00AM to 11:00AM, 11;30AM to

1:30PM, and a combined class from 2:00PM to 4:00PM.

There will be classes for beginners, intermediates and/or advanced competitive. People taking the course would attend only one class each day except for the possibility of attending the final combined class on Sunday.

Mike Beaudrias will coordinate the lessons and arrange for signup sheets. We hope to have a continuing course of instruction

for new curlers during the first few months of the season.

There will be no charge for the T-U Curling School for new members without previous curling experience. This is an important issue to stress to your prospects-We will have competent instructors who will teach them how to curl and at no extra cost. It's like a free golf pro but who ever heard of that.

Similarly there will be no charge for those who have had

less than one full season of curling experience.

Kay Sugahara has generously agreed to underwrite the cost of

this part of the program for three years.

For those of us who have had more than one full year of curling experience the cost of the full course will be \$75.00 per person. This is a good program and I trust that many of you will take advantage of it. We intend to invite Nutmeg and Plainfield members to participate.

MEN'S CURLING---As a result of the survey taken last year the combined curling committee of all three clubs met in the spring and proposed that all three clubs merge their week-night curling into one league. Members of all three clubs would be ranked according to ability and then assigned to teams without regard to which club they are affiliated with. This league will curl on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings for the first half of the season. NY Caledonian, after polling their members, has notified the committee chairman, Kay Sugahara, that they do not wish to participate in this league but would prefer to curl by themselves. Ardsley and St. Andrew's will therefore join forces for week-night curling and the committee will have to find ice time for NY Caledonian on some other night.

Week-night curling will start on Tuesday, October 25th. and weekend curling will start on Saturday October 29th.

The committee has also set aside Monday evening for a competitive league in which members would make up their own four man team. This league will be limited to six teams who would play a round robin competition. At the end of the round robin new teams would be permitted to enter. These teams may also be made up without regard to club affiliation.

The committee will also make ice available at an earlier hour on either Tuesday or Wednesday for an open league in which

any member from any club, man or woman, can participate.

Men's weekend curling would remain the same as last year with each club making up their own teams for the Wilds competition.

They beat a Nutmeg rink skipped by Ed Morley by the score of 7-6 in this hotly contested match that was not over until the Nutmeg skip delivered his second rock in the 10th and final end. Burns had the hammer but was not required to play his second rock.

Bob Whitman, skipping Ardsley =1, with Ed Godbold at third, Herb MacIntosh at two and Doug Bauman at lead, defeated Canadian Club of New York by a score of 12-7 to win the third place Ardsley Medal.

Meanwhile, back at the rink, Ardsley #2, skipped by Eunky Harmon with Ashley Griggs at three, Dick McCray at two, and Bruce May at lead, was playing Philadelphia for the NY Caledonian Medal, the second event prize. Philadelphia prevailed but the Ardsley curlers did win the runner-up medal.

The 4th event was won by Garden State #1 (Pete Mitchell-skip), and the 5th event was won by Garden State #2 (Larry Green-skip) who defeated Lake Placid (Ed Brandt-skip). Those of you who were present at the 1988 Douglas International will remember that these same two skips met in the finals of the first event which was won by Ed Brandt's rink.

The sixth event brought another victory to the home team. Carl Forcheskie and his St. Andrews rink of Howie Zwiefel, Ken Knoll, and Tom Foulk defeated Plainfield to win the St. Andrews Medal.

#### SKIPS

all skips, whether it be in the men's, mixed, or ladies competitions, have certain duties beyond directing their teams once they get cut on the ice. Most important of all is that they have an obligation to contact every member of their rink and make certain that those curlers understand to which rink they have been assigned and that they all will have an equal opportunity to curl. The skips should then prepare a schedule listing each member's curling dates for the full competition. Making up rink assignments from week to week as the competition progresses must be avoided at all costs.

Once the team gets out on the ice the skip should remind his teammates of the various rules and courtesies of the game as necessary. And finally, even though it may be the job of the "second" on the winning team to enter the score in the book, it is the skip's responsibility to make certain that the entry is made correctly both in the book and on the score card on the bulletin board.


# PRACTICE AND INSTRUCTION


# ALL AMERICAN
