Ardsley curiers were well represented at the 3 GNCC 5 & Under Bonspiels held this year. Ardsley teams made it to the finals in all, and won the first event at both the Kayser and the Childs!

The first victory came at this year's Kayser 5 & Under Mixed Bonspiel held at the Schenectady Curling Club, February 12-15. It was attended by 40 teams, 4 of Which were from Ardsley with another Ardsley member playing for a joint Plainfield/Ardsley/Brooklyn team.

Ardsley women scored final event victories in both the A and D events at the Elisabeth Childs Five and Under Borspiel held at the Potomac Curling Club, March 12-15 which had 31 teams playing.

Ardsley men had a good showing with two teams making it to the finals at the Francis Dykes Men's 5 & Under, Feb 25 - Mar 1 at Broomstones. There were 56 total teams competing this year.

ARDSLEY WINS THE 2015 KAYSER!

For the first time since 2002, an Ardsley based rink won the GNCC's Kayser 5 & Under Mixed Bonspiel. The team was lucky to escape a tough semi-final which saw them down 3 in the 8th end, only to score 4 for the win. They went on to win the final in 7 ends, and finished with a 5-0 record. The team, officially registered as the The Apple Polishers for a School Daze themed bonspiel, also won 2nd place in the costume contest for their matching Ardsley "Sweep Hard or Die" shirts and Catholic School Girl skirts. The uniforms were donned both on and off the ice with style.
