The 2022 PCC championship was held in Calgary the first week of November. Ardsley was well represented with 4 current or former members keeping ACC on the world curling map, playing for 3 different countries! Andrew Stopera viced for team USA. The American men won bronze in the A-Division and earned the USA a spot in the world curling championship.



Stephanie Lee and Ken Hsu, who began curling at Ardsley, but moved to Seattle a couple years ago, represented Chinese Taipei.

Stephanie played 2nd for the women's team and won gold in the B-division. This victory will promote them to A division next year.

In the B-division, team India won the silver medal in the men's bracket. Ardsley's Vinay Goenka played 2nd for the team.

Additional GNCC members from Plainfield, Brooklyn Lakeside, and Charlotte Curling clubs represented team Kenya and team Nigeria. We congratulate them all!



IN MEMORIAM HOWARD "BUNKIE" HARMON

Sept 3, 1932 - Nov 13, 2022

Howard Leslie Harmon, Jr, affectionately known as "Bunkie" was born in NYC, but lived close to Irvington most of his life. He worked at the New York Telephone Company for 33 years, and served in the Air Force and Air Force reserves for many years. His lifelong love of his Harvard alma mater was shown by yearly attendance at Harvard/Yale games.



Bunkie enjoyed curling, joining ACC in the late 1960s. He served on the board and held many positions at the Ardsley Curling Club including President. Notably, he was the longest serving Treasurer of the GNCC for 24 years from 1989 until 2013. In 2001, he was chosen as one of 20 lads to represent the USA on the Scots Tour, a huge honor that happens once every 10 years.






Bucket Friendly

Lulu proposes a new scoring system for the Monday competive league.




Ross Tarlton in its 53rd year
