

STOPERA WINS THIRD STRAIGHT GOLD AT

JUNIOR NATIONALS

As skip of his High Performance team, Andrew Stopera sailed through the round robin and won the final against Team Steinhaus. Stopera and his team, Luc Violette, Ben Richardson, Graem Fenson, and Riley Fenson went undefeated in the event. They will represent Team USA at Worlds in Liverpool, Canada this February.

The 2019 Junior Nationals were held January 13-19 in Two Harbors, MN. Ardsley CC contributed three players to the event this year. Competing against Andrew and 6 other boys' teams were Mathew Rosenbloom, a former Ardsley Junior player now curling out of Rochester, and Danny Casper of Ardsley. Their team, the Hipke Rink, was presented with the Curtis Cup Award for sportsmanship. Heartbreakingly, they lost every game, three were lost on the last shot.



On the girls side, Team Dubberstein of Portage outlasted Team Flannery to take the title of Team USA to Worlds.
