The team was formed last minute during September. Danny was skip. Marius Kleinas of Cape Cod Vice, Sam Willertz of Midland was second, and a combination of Ben Grady of Philadelphia and Jake Zeman of Duluth played lead. The team must have gotten a boost of confidence after sailing through qualifying in Eveleth's Curl Mesabi in November. Bill Stopera helped bring the team more together through our sole practice session over the holidays. Ben had to drop out after qualifying, and Danny was able to find Jake without a team in December.



At Nationals, Team Casper got out of the gate fast starting 3-1 with it's loss coming against the High Performance Team Sinnett. That game was close. However, they hit the skids after getting swallowed by HP's Team Viollette and could not get the win in its last two to qualify for the three team page playoffs. Team Violette handled a resurgent Team Tuma out of St Paul for the 2020 title and will head to Siberia for Junior Worlds.

Golden Handle




