
Curling this Fall: what to expect

We'll be doing things differently this season. The board has been working on strategies to open the club safely. A set of COVID-19 rules can be found on the ACC web site. Below is a brief summary of what you can expect as you begin curling in October.

DON'T CURL IF YOU FEEL SICK WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES

- 1 Arrive at the club no more than 10 min before your game dressed for curling.
- 2 Select one of the warm room chairs as yours for the curling draw, change your shoes, leave your gear bag, coat, and other items with your chair while you curl.
- 3 Avoid using the downstairs locker area. Bathrooms will be available, but do not store gear or coats downstairs.
- 4 Enter the ice when you are ready to curl. Don't wait for everyone to go out on the ice at the same time. Stone colors were determined before the game so you can wipe down YOUR OWN stones before the game begins.
- 5 No handshakes or clustering near the hack. If you are not throwing or sweeping, position yourselves 6 feet apart beyond the hog line.

SOCIAL DISTANCING



- 6 Curl with only one sweeper. No defensive sweeping. The non-active players, including skips, should maintain social distance. Marks on the ice will assist.
- 7 During the game, touch only your own stones with your hands. You may kick other stones to the side or push them with your curling broom. Don't share stabilizers or brooms.
- 8 Observe a HARD cutoff time for the game to end. Everyone from an early draw should be OFF the ice, changed back into street shoes, and OUT of the building before the late draw arrives. This might mean stopping an end in the middle if you run out of time!!
- 9 Take your stuff home. No storage of curling equipment allowed at the club.
- 10 No broomstacking at the club.




Please consider donating to the club this year, even if you are not curling.
