The Wednesday Night Men's League (The Blanton)

A NY Caledonian rink travelled to Cornwall,Ontario to participate in their 7th Annual Mixed bonspiels at their beautiful,6 sheet facility. Jeff Lesuk, Robin Gestring, Joyance Meechai and Plainfield curler Mark Mooney beat teams from Navan and Prescott (both nearOttawa) in 6 ends in the first 2 games, but fell just short in the A Event Semi-Final against another Prescott team that was a four time previous champ. Due to an odd draw,there was no consolation event,so it was A Event to elimination. A great time was had by all due to the hospitality of curlers Pete and Jean Murphy who hosted the team on Thur night (like royalty) and to new Ardsley curlers Nancee and Dave Cruickshank who hosted the team in Cornwall (in the manner to which they' ve become recently accostomed).

Around Veterans Day, 16 GNCC and 16 Ontario Curling Association teams play four, eight end games and the largest stone total determines who wins the coveted international Ross Tarlton Shield. Another miracle happened this year because the GNCC teams won the shield, now two years in a row.

The Ross Tarlton Shield (bonspiel) was modeled in 1967 by Ross Tarlton, Linc Siebert and Ted Childs exactly like the Gordon International Medal (bonspiel) which started in 1884 between the Canadian Branch of the Royal Caledonian CC (the Montreal area curling association) and the GNCC. The site of both bonspiels alternates between countries. "These are friendly games to promote goodwill and get to know one another".*

This year, the Ardsley CC team was Steve Hess, Pete McCuen, George Cowles and Jim McGinnis. The GNCC Officers team was Bunkie Harmon (GNCC Treasurer), Geoff Broadhurst (GNCC/USCA Board Member), Carl Thomas (GNCC 1st VP) and Dick McCartney (GNCC 2nd VP). The competition was held at Broomstones CC, The Country Club and Cape Cod CC.

The closing dinner at TCC on Saturday eve was a festive event with a piper leading in the head table and speeches. Just before the top secret winner of the competition is announced and the winner and runner-up medals are awarded, The Collie Campbell Memorial Award is



presented to a person in recognition of his "sportsmanship, leadership and devotion to the best traditions of curling". At the inaugural 1967 RT bonspiel, the Hon. Colin A. Campbell was elected to be a life member to the GNCC because of his "incredible contribution to Curling, National and International". After Collie died in 1978, the GNCC established The Collie Campbell Award and the first recipient was Ross Tarlton in 1980 and the second was Ted Childs in 1981. This year, the 41th recipient was Geoff Broadhurst. "All recipients receive an Eskimo Carving and show it with great pride". Geoff thanked The Ross Tarlton Shield trustees for this honor and appreciated the recognition for his efforts to <u>Grow Curling from the Bottom Up</u> such as helping membership growth and club formation, facilitating stones to arena clubs and providing club incorporation and nonprofit documents. There are 52 curling clubs, curling on

arena ice in the USA and with help; they will be curling on their own dedicated curling facility someday soon.

In November 2010, Ardsley CC and Nutmeg have offered to host the Ross Tarlton Shield. The Double Tree Hotel in Norwalk is booked to house the teams.

WHY IS OUR CLUB NEWSLETTER CALLED "DUCK SOUP"?

Searching the

HISTORY of the ARDSLEY CURLING CLUB Compiled by Joseph P. Ringland

1973

The frequent news letter appeared "ith the name "Duck Soup" for the first time dated December 27, 1943. Stu Deabody is responsible for that title.



From 1932 to 1967, Ardsley curled at St. Andrews. All stones were delivered standing in the hack and swinging your arm back while holding the stone. The stone was supposed to land flat on the ice and continue on to its mark. But Ardsley lads only curled there once a week and often landed the stone unevenly: so the stone waddled down the ice like a duck. Thus St. Andrews mockingly gave us our unique mascot, the Ardsley "DUCK".

Why "Soup"? Perhaps Stu borrowed the name from one of the funniest movies ever. Google says *Duck Soup* is a <u>1933 Marx Brothers anarchic comedy film</u> written by <u>Bert Kalmar</u> and <u>Harry Ruby</u>, with additional dialogue by <u>Arthur Sheekman</u> and <u>Nat Perrin</u>, and directed by <u>Leo</u> <u>McCarey</u>. First released theatrically by <u>Paramount Pictures</u> on November 17 1933, it starred

what were then billed as the "Four Marx Brothers" (<u>Groucho</u>, <u>Harpo</u>, <u>Chico</u>, and <u>Zeppo</u>). It was the last Marx Brothers film to feature Zeppo, and the last of five Marx Brothers movies released by Paramount.^[1]

Practice Time Reservation

With the potential of having more bonspiels/playdowns at the club this year, and the resulting need for team practices, we have developed an ice reservation system on our website for reserving time for team practices. The system is easy to use and we hope will prevent showing up with a group to practice and finding all sheets in use. We will start with some simple basic rules which should suffice for making the system work effectively for all.

The system is for the use of members only. Ice can be reserved in 30-minute segments for up to two hours at a time. We ask all to please check the Ice

Schedule (menu on left) to be sure that the time you want is not already scheduled for club functions.

To use the system go to the website (<u>www.ardsleycurling.org</u>), login as a member, and click on Reservations on the menu. Select the date(s) you want from the drop down menu. Select which sheet you want and then the time block(s) you want. You will receive a simple reservation form to complete and submit. Assuming no conflicts with the current schedule, you will receive a confirmation. If you get no subsequent messages to the contrary, the ice is yours. If for any reason you must cancel your reservation, return to the system and do so. Depending on the demand for available ice, the club reserves the right to cancel reservations for multiple sheets or reservations made more than two weeks in advance.

Joyance Meechai has volunteered to monitor the system for any scheduling difficulties. Should any changes be required of confirmed reservations due to club needs, etc., the reserver will be contacted by Joyance. If you have any scheduling questions, please contact Joyance at <u>Joyance.Meechai@reval.com</u>.

If you have any questions/problems concerning the system itself, please contact Pete McCuen at curlingpete@aol.com. Since this is a new system for us, it is probably not unreasonable to expect a glitch or two.


