Fortunately many Ardsley men signed up to be substitutes; so another team got to play (Jim Gutekunst, Steve Hess, Ed Andrews and Tim Klein) when Albany dropped out for medical reasons. Other subs played including Norm Laird, Robert Baensch and Walter Baggett. The GNCC team included Bunkie Harmon, (GNCC Treasurer & RT Trustee), Geoff Broadhurst (GNCC Club and Membership Growth), Carl Thomas (GNCC President), and Dick Macartney (GNCC VP).

In the past, the RT was held in Rochester, Utica, Albany/Schenectady and Boston/Cape Cod. Now that Nutmeg CC has a 3 sheet facility, the BODs of Ardsley and Nutmeg agreed two years ago to hold the bonspiel at our clubs Nov. 11 – 13.
