#### RULES OF COMPETITION

#### Rink Personnel and Substitutes

- 1. A rink must have at least two of its original members.
- 2. A rink may play with three members only if no legal substitute is available. In such a case, the <u>Lead and Second</u> shall lay three stones each.
- You may substitute position for position except in the case of a Skip's absence.
  - (a) If the Skip is absent, the Vice-Skip must move up to Skip. A Skip may substitute in the Vice-Skip position or, the Skip may substitute as Lead, with the regular Lead and Second moving up.
  - (b) If the Vice-Skip is absent, a Vice-Skip may substitute in her position, or she may substitute as Lead with the regular Lead and Second moving up.
  - (c) If the Second is absent, a Second may substitute in her position.
  - (d) If the Lead is absent, a Lead may substitute in her position.
  - (e) If both the Skip and Vice-Skip are absent, two Vice-Skips or a Skip and Vice-Skip may be allowed, providing the Skip plays third position.
  - (f) If the only original rink members are Skip and Vice-Skip, another Skip may not substitute.
- 4. If a player is unavoidably late, she may enter the game up to the beginning of the third end. If she has not arrived by then, a substitute may enter the game.
- 5. A player must sign-in as a substitute for an event if she expects to be absent for more than one-third of the games in that event.

### Rink Responsibilities

- The <u>Lead</u> shall arrange the stones before play at the beginning of each end. The <u>Lead</u> shall toss the coin at the beginning of a match.
- The <u>Second</u> of the winning rink shall record the score in the book.
- 3. The <u>Vice-Skip</u> shall be responsible for measuring stones when there is doubt as to which are the counters. The <u>Vice-Skips</u> also post the end-by-end score.
- 4. The <u>Skip</u> shall be responsible for notification of times for all matches and seeing that all rules are followed.

### Play of Matches

- 1. Maximum number of ends in all events is limited to ten ends except in case of tie.
- 2. All matches must be played on the day and sheet as scheduled except when cancelled due to bad weather.
- 3. All matches start play promptly at the appointed time. Any rink not ready to play shall forfeit one point and one end for the first full 15 minutes delay and for each additional 15 minutes or any fraction thereof. It is mandatory that these points be scored. At the end of 30 minutes, the game shall be forfeited. When play begins, after penalty points have been imposed, the conventional toss of a coin shall determine last stone.

#### CURLING COURTESY

Courtesy and respect for fellow curlers are among the most significant of all curling customs. An understanding of the Unwritten Rules of Good Behavior is essential to the enjoyment of The Game.

- 1. Never distract a player about to deliver his stone by talking.
- 2. It is very disconcerting to the player for those on the ice ready to sweep to cross over to the other side while the Skip is giving instructions to the man in the hack. Decide in advance which side you want to sweep on and remain still and at the edge until the stone is on the way.
- 3. Leads and seconds are not allowed in the goal area until after the score has been determined by the Vice-Skips.
- 4. As their turn comes to play, curlers should be in the hack with stone cleaned and ready to take Skip's instructions as promptly as possible.
- 5. Confine your attention to your own game rather than watching play on another sheet.
- 6. Every game ends with a hearty handclasp of good will to both teammates and opponents.
- 7. No player ever deliberately breaks a rule of the game; and should he do so inadvertently and be aware of it, he is the first to divulge the breach. He should take a burned stone out of play immediately, before it has a chance to dislodge other stones.
