Scoring

Wins will count first. If only one team out of the eight wins three games, that team is the winner. If a team in each division has won three games, the team which has scored the most rocks will win. If there is still a tie, the team scoring the most ends will win. In case a tie remains there will be a play-off. If there is no three-game winner, the two-game winner which scored the most rocks and then most ends will be the winner. No points for a dead end. Rocks and ends for an extra end are included. Vice-skips will record points.

Pinch in 3 man rule

Rules All games will be ten ends. An extra end must be played in case of a tie. USWCA rules apply except for substitutes and team members.

+ Infelme Pinch rules will be followed with the exception of 3 - This will be a pincher

Rinks The first name listed for each team is the Skip. She may arrange the other members of the rink in any order for each game. Only one club-rated Skip may play on a team. Scoring

Wins will count first. In case of a tie we will use a point system of 1 point for each end and 1/2 point for each stone. Stones and ends for an extra end are to be included. No points for a dead end. Please be sure to record points. In case a tie remains there will be a play-off.

Rules

All games will be 10 (ten) ends. An extra end must be played in case of a tie. USWCA rules apply except for substitutes, team members and forfeitures. Ardsley rules will be followed with the exception of rule 3. There will be no forfeitures. If for a legitimate reason a team cannot be fielded the skip should call the Sports Chairman and the Sports Committee will reschedule the match.

Rinks

The first name listed for each team is the Skip. She may arrange the other members of the rink in any order for each game. While there are only five people who have signed as substitutes, any member of the Ardsley Ladies may be used as a substitute. It should not be necessary to play with a three member rink and for this reason there will be a 1 stone penalty for a three man rink. Skips are responsible for getting subs. Please let your skip know early when you cannot curl.
