USCA. This Wellesley meeting was held in the fall of 1977.


Louise Corry will be the liason for the Thursday Evening

The Secretary henceforth will send a copy of the minutes to Mary Jean Keenan (Publicity) to enable her to pass on to Duck Soup whatever gems of wisdom or news are contained therein.

Treasurer Carol Meszaros reported a balance of \$303.68.

The bonspiel policy was restated: Ladies going on a bonspiel (including the USWCA bonspiel) pay their own expenses and entry fees.

A resolution was passed that Carol Meszaros and Jane Wells be authorized to sign checks for A.L.C.C.
