The twenty women represent many clubs in Scotland and are chosen for their compatibility, their curling ability, and their stamina. The latter is all-important as the following schedule explains; they arrive in Chicago on January 10, curl in the area then on to Milwaukee and Portage, Wisconsin, Mapleton and Duluth, Minnesota; Hershey, Pennsylvania; New York-Connecticut area; and on to Boston before returning to Prestwick on January 31. They will be curling approximately 116 games in 21 days -- plus meeting new riends, parties and sightseeing. A STURDY LOT --- THE SCOTS!!!

Two rinks from Ardsley, Nutmeg, Utica, and the Wicks have been invited to curl against the Scots; and one rink each from Norfolk, Schenectady, and Albany. We wish everyone could be included from all the clubs...but, just not enough days.
