THREE BROOMS COMPETITION ANNUAL REPORT 1985-1986

The weather, reduced numbers, illness and other obligations of members caused difficulty with this year's Three Brooms matches. Both December and January games had to be hurriedly rescheduled because of snowstorms. Although the three clubs agreed to allow members to play in all three matches starting this season (while still limiting a person to skip once), we could not round up a full second team for the last event and had to call on a member of Nutmeg to complete the rink. No Friendlies were held. (We had lots of people available in December, but Wicks begged off - January would have been difficult and February impossible for us.)

We hosted the first event - December 14, postponed from the 7th. Our refreshment committee, Jeanne Heffner and Bobbie Paterson, held the breakfast in abeyance for a week.
