The board meeting of the Ardwick was held Tuesday, October 17, 1989 at Bobbie Patterson's house. Co-President Shirley Bruce opened the meeting at 10:20 am.

Three Brooms will be held:

Thursday night, December 7, at Ardsley, Candlewicks vs. Eves
Friday morning, February 2, at Nutmeg
Friday morning, March 2, at Ardsley, ARDWICKS hosting

Empire State Bonspiel will be at Utica, Jan 15 - 17.

Nutmeg has suggested we hold Friendlies for the curlers left at home on Jan. 17, at either club, possibly a Medley type. We could also hold a similar Friendly Jan 24 (the week of the Bay State Bonspiel) and February 17 when the USWCA Bonspiel is held in Schnectady. Consensus was that this was a good idea and should be tried.

Nutmeg will be holding its official Friendly Tuesday & Wednesday, January 9 & 10.

USWCA Bonspiel, February 14 - 17, will be at Schnectady. Allocations will be a percent of the participating clubs in the area, meaning those whose "Good Faith" money has been received. If a team is not picked out of the hat, the \$50 is returned. The board approved sending our "Good Faith" money in at once.

Program

From the signup sheets at the luncheon, Nadja McKay knows we have 21 curlers, but not everyone curls both days. Plans were approved for the first half of our season to hold the AA on Wednesday mornings, when we will have more curlers. The Candlewicks will also hold their own round-robin AA during the first half of the season, then the winners from each group will have to find a mutual time to have a deciding game for the All-American Pin. We plan to have a double round-robin, beginning Nov. 1 and going through Dec. 13.

Thursday morning curlers will participate in a Clan Event.

The second half of the year will be set-up later, hopefully to include a Medley and possibly a laddar.

Openhouse

October 25 & 26 the Ardwick's will hold an openhouse for curlers interested in daytime curling. Bring a sandwich, our hospitality chair-people Jan Conner and Heather Kenney will supply deserts, coffee, tea, etc. Jinny Hill will request a bar tender and Carol Mezzaros will notify our membership of these plans.

Mrs. Conner then explained why the two accounts were still separate. The Scarsdale National Bank, where the Westchester Wicks' money had been held for many years, has been taken over by the Bank of New York. If the name on the account remains the same (Westchester Wicks) BONY will honor the agreement the old customers had with the Scarsdale National Bank and will not charge for the account. If the name is changed to ARDWICKS we would be charged per check plus a monthly service charge. Mrs. Conner's contact at the bank suggested that if possible no changes be made. The Board agreed to retain the name, Westchester Wicks, on the two accounts, but that it be stated in the minutes that these funds belong to the ARDWICKS.

Jan Conner moved that we put the Ardsley Ladies Curling Club Savings Account into the Westchester Wicks savings account and that both Marion Cowles and Jan Conner be legal signers. Seconded by Jinny Hill. Passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:35am .

2. **Green slip**, to notify me of the winners in your club.



ARDWICK BOARD MEETING
January 31, 1990

Present: Hanlon, Bruce, Patterson, McKay, Kenny, Smith, Hill, Garrison

The meeting was held at the Ardsley Curling Club. The minutes were read and accepted as corrected.

The treasurers report was given and a copy attached to this report. At this point there is a balance of _____ in the treasury. A discussion ensued about establishing a new account under the Ardwick name, and whether it should be a money market checking/savings or straight checking account. More information is needed.

A decision was made to reimburse Bob Hill for Claire Nobles contribution to the raffle, made in her honor.

It was suggested that a follow up be done on the payment of dues. Bobbie will request a report from Jan Connor.

Shirley Bruce suggested that since there are so few substitutes, that we consider a rink as legal if only one team member is present (just for the remainder of this year.) However, it was suggested that rules be reconsidered at the beginning of next year.

A motion was made that the notepaper left over from last year be sold at 12 for \$5.00. Marcella volunteered to put them in bags and display them for sale.

The Nutmeg Friendly on January 17th was enjoyed by 5 Ardwickers. We will plan to have a friendly for Nutmeg on February 22nd.

It was suggested that we design a new pin for Ardwickers and Candlewickers (same pin for both). Burns Patterson might be willing to help us with that. A combination of the Ardsley and Wicks pin in miniature might be a consideration. Shirley offered to look into pin providers.

Shirley suggested that we have post cards at the Empire State at Schenectady next year to advertise our Empire State the following year. All agreed.

A discussion of pins for 1989-90 events took place. In addition to the regular event pins it was thought that some miscellaneous pins such as the most improved player be considered.

It is felt that there should be greater communications between all members so that everyone is aware of who attends the 3 Brooms and the Bonspiels and that more opportunity be made available for all members, old and new to participate. It was suggested that people sign up early in the year for the 3 Brooms.

USWCA

The USWCA is the governing body of Ladies Curling in the U.S. The association has been formed and exists to promote and conserve the best interests of the game of curling throughout the United States; to cultivate friendly relations among its member clubs; to promote international friendships; to preserve the traditions and literature of the game; to hold, each year, the USWCA National Bonspiel, and the USWCA Senior Bonspiel; and to provide the regulations for events sponsored by the USWCA and will abide by the current ICF rules of play.

The country is divided into four districts and the President, 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents rotate on a one year term between all districts . The two bonspiels rotate on the same basis - the USWCA National Bonspiel, a 32 team spiel , and the USWCA Senior Bonspiel - a minimum 16 team spiel for ladies aged 55 and over, shared on membership between the four districts. It also sponsors a U.S./Scotland tour, a Friendship tour between the U.S. and Canada and the All American event curled in all member clubs across the country. This is all accomplished with a membership fee of \$5.00 per club and \$3.00 per individual member.

Membership by division is -Eastern, Central Area, Wisconsin, Western Area , with a total club count of 72 and an individual membership count of 3714.

The USWCA and the USCA are in negotiation with a third proposal to the USCA requesting a written and binding agreement for the USWCA to become an affiliate of the USCA and to retain its own treasury and control of all ladies curling events as described in paragraphs 1 and 2.

The USCA, through the local district, the GNCC, charges a larger primary membership for men which includes the subscription to the Curling News. The Club pays a secondary membership for ladies, again larger than the USWCA, if the local clubs choose to participate. This fee gives no benefits to the ladies as no funds are directed to ladies curling at the club level. Ladies curling has been, and continues to be, supported by the USWCA.

We, the ARDWICKS, respectfully request that the USWCA membership continue to be paid from the ice fees collected, as is the GNCC membership fee.

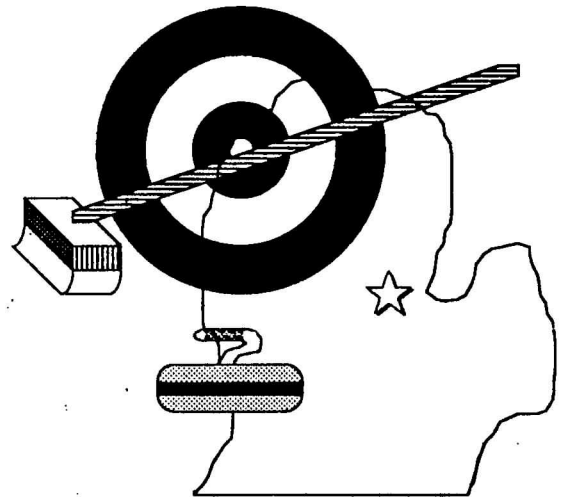

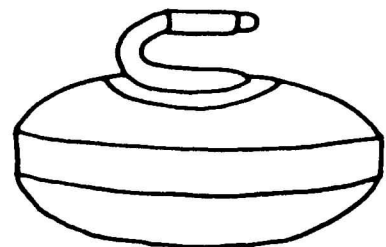


