

ARDWICKS FALL MEETING

October 27, 2000

The meeting was held at the Ardsley Country Club prior to the Opening Dinner of the Ardsley Curling Club. There were 9 members present.

President Broadhurst opened the meeting at 6 pm.

She announced that January will be an exciting month for the Ardwick curlers. Both the Scots Ladies Tour and the Empire States will take place here.

Scots Tour - 20 curlers plus 2 chaperones will be here January 9 and 10, 2001. Hostesses for overnight stays are being organized.

Jan. 10 - NYC outing - NBC tour and possibly Rosie O'Donnell Show - 7 am train - return by 5 pm. USWCA is asked to pay for train tickets.

7:30 pm - Party at the Kenny's - ham, turkey, salad - Tom will bartend, the Purkey's will donate white wine.

Jan. 11 - 9 am departure.

A Chairperson is needed. Kay Sugahara is donating glass apples as gifts for the Scots. Suggestions: Take lots of pictures, develop quickly for instant distribution. Don't skimp! Above the entry fee, a \$75 donation per club will be sought.

Please review the Ardwick Constitution per officers and elections.

If I remember correctly, it says that the offices of President and Vice Presidents are elected in the EVEN years and the offices of Secretary and Treasurer are elected in the ODD years (2001). This is done so you won't be lose the whole board in one year.

You still have time to do the elections in the Fall. If Jean and Marion want to stay on it might be a good idea. Jean is great to have on your team because she is very capable and handles the money effortlessly and Marion takes great notes and you don't have to prompt her to do so...she makes it look very easy.

I also think you have to send out a 60 day advanced notification to all of the members telling them that an election will be taking place and who the nominees are. They cannot take it one for just one year or you will get out of the election cycle that has been set up per the Constitution.
