ARDSLEY LADIES CURLING

The meeting of the Board of the Ardsley Ladies Curling was held on September 14, 1971, at the home of Sirkka Whitman.

The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. Whitman, who made the following announcements:

1. We hope to have ice by the first week in November and to hold practice sessions then, prior to our first competition.
2. Ginny Reynolds will be asked to be Prize Chairman and Hazel Budd to be House Chairman.
3. The opening luncheon will be held on October 29th at the Ardsley Country Club.
4. Ruth MacKenzie has had to resign as Secretary. The Nominating Committee will be asked to fill the vacancy.

Treasurer, Sue Richards, announced that there is \$305.13 in the savings account and \$132.83 in the checking account. She also stated that \$50.00 of the money in the savings account is the property of the Teenage Curlers, who have no separate account.

First vice-president, Mary Jean Keenan, announced that she will make up the schedules for the first competition after the opening luncheon.

Second vice-president and bonspiel chairman, Bobbie Patterson, announced that the Ladies Friendly will be held on December 8th and 9th, and that she is working on hotel accommodations. It was suggested that she check with the Hilton Inn to see if they will give a special rate if all the rooms are reserved there. She also stated that she will try to arrange Wednesday afternoon competitions with the Westchester Wicks.

Membership Chairman, Arden Frederick, asked that the ladies attempt to have a curling open house for prospective members which would give them an opportunity to really try curling; the open house to be followed by one of our delicious sandwich luncheons.

The board suggested that Maggie Smith be asked to help teach us during the practice week.

The board ~~also~~ ^{Also} suggested that a ladder competition be held on Friday mornings; rinks to be chosen from those signing up for the competition. The ladder competition would start in January and a Pairs competition would be held until the December Bonspiel.

It was recommended by the Board that President, Sirkka Whitman, ask the Curling Club Board for permission to charge brand new lady curlers only \$25.00 to curl during the first competition. If they elected to curl during the remainder of the year, they would then be required to pay the balance of the yearly dues.

The next meeting will be held on October 5, 1971, at 12:30p.m. at the home of Sirkka Whitman.

MIXED CURLING COMMITTEE

MINUTES OF MEETING

November 29, 1971

A Mixed Curling Committee Meeting was held on November 29, 1971 at 8:00PM at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Edward J. Doonan. In attendance were: Wells, Nolans, Keenans, Patersons, MacIntoshes, Selfs, Betsy Fislser and the Doonans. This gave the opportunity for various committee reports and to help the Doonans, as new chairmen, to get the over-all status of activities and to lay the groundwork for the balance of competitions this year.

One hundred and nine persons are active in mixed curling -- 22 Rinks, 6 couples on substitutes list, plus nine individuals who can be called upon as substitutes. Contact will be made with the substitute list to see if any of them intend to do regular mixed curling in the next competition.

Scheduling - With the coming holidays and home bonspiels absorbing so much of the weekend ice, our upcoming competitions will have some variations to the normal Saturday-Sunday afternoons and evening play; and the scheduled beginning of the next competitions will be advanced up to December 26, as well as using some Friday nights. This will permit more activity and utilization of the available ice.

Presently our scheduled ice is for Fridays at 8:00 P. M. - Saturdays at 5:30 P. M. on -- Sundays at 3:00 P. M. on.

Funspiels - Fislser ran a very successful evening on Friday after Thanksgiving and plan another for December 10. With Christmas Eve out and New Year's Eve all scheduled, we will have to consider the use of Friday nights for regular schedules during January and February, as mentioned above under "Scheduling."

New Year's Eve - The Havens will head up the committee for this event and are in process of setting up the details building up to a successful evening.

Ardsley Mixed Bonspiel - January 7, 8, & 9 - Nolans reported on the status of this event. It is too early to get responses from the field. Communication with the Country Club on arrangements have been carried on, but officially the Directors' Meeting at the Club tonight is to establish when the closing date is for winter shutdown. Doonan is to post a notice on the bulletin board so as to establish whatever playdowns are necessary in arriving for Ardsley Rink entries.

Out of Town Bonspiels & Friendlies

MacIntoshes reported on this area. Plainfield has the Friendly this year (alternating years with Nutmeg). The date suggested is January 29 and 30, 1972. St. Andrew's date will be checked on and notice posted as well as having ice scheduled for the events home & home Saturday and Sunday. Invitations from other clubs and bonspiels have been posted on the bulletin board and signatures on these will indicate any need for play-down.

Closing Dinner - The concensus of the group was that last year's closing day with curling round robbin, awards for year's competition, supper, and music at the Warm Room was very successful and satisfactory, instead of any formal closing dinner. We will try to set up for that day's awards for 1st and 2nd or 1st and last, so as to establish the yearly award of the "double broom" given to us by Canadian friends of the Selfs to be put into a competition.

Master Schedule - Mr. Wells is having one drawn up to cover all use of the ice. This should assist in scheduling for regular competition as well as playdowns, make ups and encourage use of free ice time. Mr. Brandt is making up the Master Schedule.

Bar Service - Meetings between our curling club officers and those of the Country Club will set up rules for bar service and liquor consumption at the Rink. Basically, it appears this will effect us only insofar as enforcing the intended use of only Country Club supplied liquor regardless of how served -- and specifically effect the "bring your own refreshment" approach of recent Funspiel night and the like. The understanding that New Year's Eve is an exception will be confirmed by E. J. Doonan as to avoid any confusion there.
