ARDSLEY LADIES CURLING
BOARD MEETING
Monday, October 9, 1986

The regular meeting of the Ladies Curling Club was held at the home of the President, M.J. Keenan. Present were Cowles, Fletcher, Garred, Hill, Keenan, Patterson, Whitley and Whitman. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as read.

The TREASURER, M. Cowles (after some discussion) reported on a balance of \$203.81.

BONSPIEL CHAIRMAN, D. Garrison was absent but sent word that she wishes to follow G. Whitley's suggestion in her annual report, i.e. Skips should decide early as to which bonspiels they would like to attend and pick their teams.

CURLING CHAIRMAN, J. Hill reported that post cards had been sent to all Ladies curlers asking for their preference to curling days. The first week of curling, Oct 29 & 30 will be for practice. The following week we will start the ARD-WICK on Weds. and the ALL-AMERICAN on Thurs. The Board agreed to ask the Night Curlers to enter a rink in the ALL-AMERICAN. This year the Ardsley Ladies will be in charge of the first ARD-WICK and the West Wick the second. Following the first event we will have a luncheon in the warm room and award the prizes. Jinny has arranged for 8 lady curlers to play during the Open House.

DUCK SOUP CHAIRMAN, C. Noble was absent but requested any and all news be sent to her.

HOUSE CHAIRMAN, G. Whitley, asked for volunteers to help with the Fall clean-up on Oct. 22?

HOSPITALITY CHAIRMAN B. Patterson will plan the menu for the opening Luncheon Oct. 25. There was a discussion about buying a set of stainless steel flat-ware with some of the Fundspiel monies.

THREE BROOMS Chairman S. Whitman announced that Ardsley will host the first event on Dec. 12th. There will be no afternoon friendlies this year. The rules have been changed to allow a person to play in all three events but only be allowed to skip in one. The other dates are Feb. 6th at Nutmeg and March 6th hosted by the Wicks.

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE will be chaired by Marion Cowles with Jinny Hill, Betty Fletcher, Judy Kelley and Doris Garrison serving on the committee.

RULES CHAIRMAN C. Meszaros was absent. It was generally agreed that point penalties were unsatisfactory and that if a two member rink show for a game they should be allowed to play without default or point penalties as they are a legal rink. We will look further into this matter and see how the Wicks handle it.

U.S.W.C.A. representative F. Garred read a long letter from the USWCA President Ann Brown. The USCA has been accepted for membership in the US Olympic Committee, having changed their by-laws to increase their board with 15 new women directors. The USCA will

will now be responsible for the US Women's Championship and all international curling. The USWCA will continue to run the National Bonspiel, Senior Bonspiel and the All-American. Diane Mojo is the member of the Rules Committee representing the Eastern area.

EMPIRE STATE Chairman F.Garred reported that 45 post cards were sent asking clubs to save the dates, Jan'14-16th. 75 tickets have been reserved for My One and Only for Jan 14th. She hopes that everyone will be in a receptive frame of mind when called upon to help with the Bonspiel. Everyone will be needed!

NEW BUSINESS It was moved seconded and passed to increase our Ladies dues from \$5 to \$10. Fran Garred was request@d to ask at the Curling Board meeting who is finacially responsible for the coffee, tea etc,as well as the paper goods. With Tuesday ice available it is hoped that it will be used for play-downs, practice for teams going away on bonspiels and play-offs. It was agreed to post the minutes of the monthly meetings on the bulletin board downstairs.

Their being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:30 p.m.

The next monthly meeting will be held November 3,1986 at 1;00pm at the home of M.J.Keenan.

The monthly meeting was held at the home of Mary Jean Keenan with the following directors present: Cowles, Fletcher, Garrison, Hill, Keenan, Meszaros, Noble, Patterson, Warriner, Whitley, & Whitman.

The minutes were approved as read.

The Treasurer Marion Cowles reported that the present bank balance is \$174.48. She will get in touch with Pat Haff when she returns to clarify some of the differences in figures in the savings account. It was recommended that the Treasurer send names of a list of the ladies curling to John DeRoos so they will receive Curling News.

Bonspiel Chairman Doris Garrison announced some of the coming bonspiels and urged people to sign up for them, suggesting that skips plan ahead and choose their teams. The invitations will be posted on the bulletin board.

Curling Chairman Jinny Hill said the Empire State Invitations had been sent out. The Ardwick competition (on Wednesdays) goes to Jan. 21. The second Ardwick will be held on Thursdays Jan. 29-Mar. 19. The last All American will be Dec. 18.

The Empire State (Jan. 13-15) was discussed. We will need a first team and a standby team in case of dropouts. Bobbie Patterson and M. J. Keenan agreed to be skips. Rules Chairman Carol Meszaros said she could use a book on rules and it was suggested new curlers be advised of basic rules & etiquette. The question came up as to how to handle the situation when just two (regular members) show up to curl. It was decided that the names of all the leads and No. 2s on the ice that day be put in a hat and one would be drawn to make up a playable team of three.



Monday, Dec. 1, 1986

President Mary Jean Keenan called the meeting to order with the following members present: Cowles, Fletcher, Garred, Garrison, Hill, Meszaros, Noble, Patterson, Warriner, and Whitley.

The minutes were approved as read.

The Treasurer Marion Cowles reported a balance of \$729.48. All questions about previous balance sheets have been cleared up. There was \$355.00 in the Empire State account before \$200 was withdrawn by Fran Garred, who said 5 more checks of \$160 each had just been received for the Empire State.

Bonspiel Chairman Doris Garrison had the unhappy news that Ardsley was 5th on the list of standbys for the National Seniors Bonspiel at Winchester (entries are chosen by draw). Fran Garred, Jinny Hill, Claire Noble, and Gerry Whitley are going to Nutmeg Fun Day tomorrow, Dec. 2. The Hershey bonspiel is Feb. 10, 11, & 12. St. Paul, Minn., is having a "Cold Cash bonspiel" Jan. 10 & 11, a subject which caused considerable comments.

Curling Chairman Jinny Hill said she had no report except that she will put up a sign up sheet for the Junior Skip competition to be held 2 weeks in Jan., on Thursday. The Scots will be here on Wed., Jan. 28, using our ice in the morning so it was decided the Wed. ladies would brown bag it that day and curl in the afternoon.

The Empire State: 8 teams have already signed up: Gloucester, Utica, Hershey, Toronto, Norfolk, Nashua, Nutmeg, and Montreal West. Fran showed the blue shopping bag to be used for the kit and said we would need score cards (index cards were suggested). Carol Meszaros asked people to stay Thursday after curling to stuff the ducks that will be used for the guests. Dick McCray will set up the bar. It was decided to have the games 10 ends. Terry Welch did not receive one of the original invitations but she will be given a later deadline to sign up.

Hospitality Chairman Bobbie Patterson announced that Ann McCray would do Christmas decorations. The tree will be put up on Thursday, Dec. 11. Alice Pedlow will order sandwiches for luncheon on Dec. 17 and is bringing fruit cake. On Dec. 18 we will bring our own sandwiches and cookies will be provided. Bobbie has bought a good supply of much needed flatware at the Elmsford Restaurant Supply, and it will be charged to the Ardsley Curling Club.

Bonspiel Chairman Gerry Whitley said supplies like cups need to be checked before the Empire State and Mary Jean will discuss that with Arthur Mojo before the Douglas. There was discussion about the St. Andrews dues coming in so late.

Hospitality Chairman Bobbie Patterson was absent. Bette Fletcher will take care of the Ardwick luncheon on Wed., Jan. 21, after curling. It was decided to charge \$3.00 apiece. Bette will make a casserole and Fran Garred will be responsible for making coffee. Bette showed us the Ardwick prizes.

U.S.W.C.A. No report.

Empire State: Chairman Fran Garred reported we have 16 teams signed up. Six teams will stay at Ardsley Acres and 5 will be put up in members' houses. The kits are in the making. The dinner theatre is charging us \$30.02 and since Fran applied last July they have given us center section seats. She paid for them in advance out of her own account. Several Ardsley husbands are expecting to attend the theatre, and it is hoped they will also lend a hand (and a little zip) during the bonspiel. Carol Meszaros is kindly donating her duck favors and will make up the mushroom baskets for the tables in the warm room, so there will be no major expense for decorations.

The welcoming cocktail party at the Doonans' house will be held Monday evening 7:30 to 9:30, and it was thought that we ought to reserve \$125 for that. Judy Kelley is in charge of the Tuesday evening dinner. Bobbie Patterson is going to make beef stew for an estimated 75 people. The Rays have donated \$35 for champagne.

A quick decision had to be made to change the number of ends from 10 to 8 because of the scheduling and pebbling. The 4th Event & Rat Rac finals will be Thursday at 9:30 and the other finals will be at 1 p.m.
