Dear John:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Ardwicks as I understand you are running the Senior Men's group this year.

In the past, the Ardwicks curled two days a week, namely Wednesdays and Thursdays. This year, due to a poll and other circumstances, it has become necessary to curl only one day a week which will be Tuesdays.

As this does not seem to pose a problem, we feel that we must justify the ladies dues of \$360.00, or upwards, by allowing them to curl more than just once a week. On that basis, we would like to propose that the ladies join the Senior Men's group once a month. We could try to work it out on a mutually agreeable day but feel that Fridays would be most beneficial as this is the only day lunches are served at the club and since we are all under the obligation of a monthly minimum, it could be used to defray this expenditure. This does not mean that the ladies and gentlemen would have to dine together, it simply means that each group could dine on the same day.

If this proposal conflicts with your scheduling, would it not be possible to urge four of your group to curl in the afternoon one Friday a month? The Ardwicks have curled with the Senior Men's group in the past and the ladies were always made to feel most welcome. We hope that this may continue.

On behalf of the Ardwicks, I would like to advise you that the Board had their first meeting and I am happy to report that we are looking forward to a very exciting year of curling.

For starters, we are going to follow a completely different format this year. We will be curling one day a week instead of two as in the past. The designated day is Tuesday. We feel that we will be able to put good quality teams together instead of just trying to fill the ice and wind up with either 3 person teams, or forfeits.

Also, we will be curling with the Thursday night Candlewicks. This will not be compulsory every Thursday night. President McKay opened the meeting held at the Ardsley Country Club at 10:45 am.

Minutes of the October 1, 1992 meeting were accepted with the notation that today's meeting is taking place on Saturday, November 7th and Jinny Hill's request that she be spelled with a \underline{J} .

Treasurer's Report was distributed and reviewed noting pins referred to in report were USWCA rather than All American pins. November 1, 1992 balance: \$971.69.

We might give some thought for next year to curl only one day a week, filling all three sheets, doubling up on teams and having byes, especially for the All American. Also possibly think in terms of the second day as a competitive league or bonspiel league for those who wish to curl more than one day and put "strong" teams together, be it only two or three teams and possibly alternating.
