ARDWICK BOARD MEETING

October 1, 1992

Present: Babcock, Bruce, Bertchie, Cowles, Glus, Hanlon, Kenny, McKay, Meszaros and Smith

President McKay opened the meeting held at the Ardsley Country Club at 10 am.

Minutes of the April 11, 1992 meeting were accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Reports were accepted as presented. September 30, 1992 balance: \$1,019.82.

Opening Luncheon: Nadja announced Jan Conner had offered her home for the luncheon, but since minimums must be met in Country Club dining room, it was decided to have it there, Saturday, Nov. 7th. It was also suggested a monthly luncheon and lingering after curling be encouraged for camaraderie.

Purchase of Measuring Device: Shirley Bruce has researched cost - approximately \$400. Since we have no commitment for fund raising this year, our numbers are down and our starting balance is lower than in '91 (by \$300), purchase of this item is tabled for now, although Shirley will pursue source and price for purchase.

Bonspiels: Diane Muldowney (Nutmeg Rep.) has proposed to Nadja "2 Brooms." Nadja had suggested she put her request in writing but has not received letter yet. Heather Kenny will contact Diane, noting we would be amenable to the format of 1 night "Broom" at Ardsley and 1 day "Broom" at Nutmeg.

USWCA: Shirley and Marcella Hanlon will attend meeting in Madison, WI Oct. 8-11. Redesigned USWCA pin was shown. Cost: \$5.50. Marcella will pick up 10 at meeting. Shirley noted membership and participation will be major push this year.

Membership: Nadja and several other of our members went to the Grand National Iceless in Nashua, NH. Of the 3 seminars offered Saturday morning, Jean MacIntosh (and some other Ardsley people) attended the one on membership. Nadja suggests formation of an entire Ardsley Curling Club Membership Committee. She also suggests the membership application include listing for "other interests" to get a broader perspective of how we can appeal to new members. The Open House Oct. 24-25.

Nominating Committee: Jan Conner, as '91-'92 Chair, "carries over." The Board elected Ginny Hill and Ritsuko Sakurai as committee members. Skips are responsible for selecting 2 others.

Curling Schedule: Carol Meszaros and Nadja reported results of survey. People want to leave schedule as is. However, our numbers dictate this is impossible. After discussion, it was agreed all those present can do Tuesdays and that will be the primary day. Day curlers, hopefully, will curl 1 or 2 evenings per month with the Candlewicks and 1 Friday morning per month with the Senior Men. Heather will see if the men are agreeable and Carol will poll other women curlers for availability on Tuesdays and other times proposed. Marcella also suggested we have open substitution.

Clean-Up Weekend: Oct. 17-18 - 9 am - 4 pm. Nadja noted we are members of the Ardsley Curling Club and are expected to do our share and put in some time during this weekend.

Curling Sweaters: Shirley displayed a cardigan, available for \$65, noting the maker also has a V-neck pullover for sale.

Ardwick Dues are due by Dec.1. This will appear with the Club dues notice.

Card Index File will be compiled by Jean Glus to track membership.

'93-'94: For scheduling purposes, it was decided to request curling plans for that season in August, 1993.

Curling Starts Tuesday, Oct. 27 - 10 am and Thursday, Oct. 29 - 7:30 pm.

The meeting was adjourned at noon.



Dear John:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Ardwicks as I understand you are running the Senior Men's group this year.

In the past, the Ardwicks curled two days a week, namely Wednesdays and Thursdays. This year, due to a poll and other circumstances, it has become necessary to curl only one day a week which will be Tuesdays.

As this does not seem to pose a problem, we feel that we must justify the ladies dues of \$360.00, or upwards, by allowing them to curl more than just once a week. On that basis, we would like to propose that the ladies join the Senior Men's group once a month. We could try to work it out on a mutually agreeable day but feel that Fridays would be most beneficial as this is the only day lunches are served at the club and since we are all under the obligation of a monthly minimum, it could be used to defray this expenditure. This does not mean that the ladies and gentlemen would have to dine together, it simply means that each group could dine on the same day.

If this proposal conflicts with your scheduling, would it not be possible to urge four of your group to curl in the afternoon one Friday a month? The Ardwicks have curled with the Senior Men's group in the past and the ladies were always made to feel most welcome. We hope that this may continue.

As you know, it is very important to keep curling alive in this area. Your cooperation in helping to keep our ladies a viable group of curlers is very important to us. Again, we are not asking your group to give up every Friday, or even all three sheets. There may only be 4 ladies who wish to participate per month but we are asking your assistance to help curling grow within our club.

Dear Ladies:

On behalf of the Ardwick's, I would like to advise you that the Board had their first meeting and I am happy to report that we are looking forward to a very exciting year of curling.

For starters, we are going to follow a completely different format this year. We will be curling one day a week instead of two as in the past. The designated day is Tuesday. We feel that we will be able to put good quality teams together instead of just trying to fill the ice and wind up with either 3 person teams, or forfeits.

Also, we will be curling with the Thursday night Candlewicks. This will not be compulsory every Thursday night. Each Ardwick will receive a form to fill out indicating what Thursday evening she may be available per month and can be scheduled for as many as she may wish. We naturally hope it will be at least once a month. We can then get to know our evening counterparts and vice versa. Again, it will help to create quality curling. This will be scheduled so that everyone can plan their time accordingly.

We are also proposing to the Senior Men's group who curl on Friday mornings, the possibility of joining them once a month. This would give those ladies who are going on a bonspiel and may wish to have a practice game the opportunity to do so. Also, the club serves lunch on Fridays and this would be a good time to use up our minimums. This, of course, is still in the proposal stage.

While all this may seem like a bit much to digest all at once, we certainly feel it is time for a change. Think of it as redecorating the "house." It gives us flexibility and if you have a friend who may be a prospective new curler, but can only curl evenings, this may give you the opportunity to occasionally curl together.

All in all, we look forward to a very exciting curling season. Our opening luncheon is scheduled for Saturday, November 7, 1992 and you will be receiving more information on this shortly.


The Open House for the entire membership will be held October 24th and 25th from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. You should bring any prospective curlers to this event as it will be very informative.

Also remember, we are all part of the entire curling club and what our club looks like depends on the entire membership. The Clean Up weekend is scheduled for October 17th and 18th. You do not have to spend the entire weekend at the club, but any time you give will be greatly appreciated.

ARDWICK BOARD MEETING

November 7, 1992

Present: Bruce, Conner, Cowles, Glus, Hill, Keenan, Kenny, McKay, Meszaros and Smith

President McKay opened the meeting held at the Ardsley Country Club at 10:45 am.

Minutes of the October 1, 1992 meeting were accepted with the notation that today's meeting is taking place on Saturday, November 7th and Jinny Hill's request that she be spelled with a J.

Treasurer's Report was distributed and reviewed noting pins referred to in report were USWCA rather than All American pins. November 1, 1992 balance: \$971.69.

Rules: Marita Smith stated Changes: A stone that hits a side board will be removed immediately from play rather than waiting to see if it returns to play. Sweeping motion shall be from side-to-side leaving no debris in front of moving stone. Sweepers shall use one broom throughout game.

Three Brooms: Nadja reported letter received from Diane Muldowney requesting "Two Brooms" also suggested retiring present trophy (no more room to write on base) and noting they had provided the trophy, and requesting a change from 10 ends to 8 (since it becomes late for evening travellers). Dates of Dec. 10th, evening at Ardsley and Feb. 5th, daytime at Nutmeg are agreeable. We prefer to stay at 10 ends, this only being once a year for the evening does not seem an insurmountable inconvenience. We suggest adding a tier to the base. On this a plaque reading "Two Brooms, Established 1992-93" will be placed. It was noted this will be the third name appearing on the trophy as this event has evolved with club changes. Ardwick's will bear expenses for trophy plinth addition. Heather Kenny will contact Diane Muldowney with our proposals.

Curling Schedule: Carole Meszaros is hopeful enough people will commit to make 6 teams for Tuesday morning play. All American competition will wait until numbers and teams are clarified. It was agreed that new people will immediately be placed on teams for play. Experienced members will join them for practice before 10 am games, arriving by 9:30 am, starting this Tuesday. Skips will form teams using a somewhat random "Fish Bowl" selection process at their meeting today.

Jinny Hill noted curlers should change shoes downstairs. Nadja stressed proper footwear is important for safety on the ice and new curlers should be made aware of this.

Hospitality: Jan Conner said 34 people are coming to today's luncheon, including 10 Candlewicks. She will place nametags on the table and have people change places before dessert to insure mixing. Jan said housekeeping supplies have been purchased and are in place. USWCA 92-93 Events Schedules will be distributed at today's luncheon. Associates attending today's luncheon will pay Jean Glus, who will run their lunch expenses through the treasury account.

Pins: Carole noted next year we will need all but Wells Wick pins. Supplies are sufficient for this year. Junior Skip pins designed last year will be used this year. Mary Jean Keenan will order pin supplies for 2 years.

Membership: Our Chairman, Jean MacIntosh, needs to be encouraged to continue Ladies' Curling and to fill this slot.

USWCA: Nadja announced Marcella Hanlon does not plan to participate in Ladies' Curling this season. She asked if it is appropriate for Marcella to continue as our Representative after this season. Marcella is not planning to go to the February Annual Meeting. Nadja looks for a volunteer to go, noting we pay for 1 trip annually.

All American: Shirley Bruce noted separate competitions can be held for day and nighttime curlers if there are 20 people in each group. This will eliminate playdown between these two groups.

USWCA Senior Bonspiel: Shirley announced will be Jan. 18-20, Arden Hills, St. Paul. 24 rinks consisting of 6 teams from each area will take part. Jean Glus will send a \$50 good faith deposit to secure a spot for an Ardwicks team. (It was noted Empire States Bonspiel occurs week earlier - Jan. 9, 10 - over weekend.) Skips will meet Tuesday after curling to discuss bonspiels.

Club Gift: Nadja suggested that instead of purchasing a new measuring device as had previously been discussed, we research buying equipment for new technique of pebbling ice with hot water. It was agreed we would contribute up to \$200 for this equipment.

Jinny said she has heard from Faith Lundgren thanking for the gift (scarf) and saying Faith hopes to curl in New Jersey this season.

Associate Member Privileges: Nadja announced dining privileges do not come with Associate Membership and this needs to be clarified to those members.




