President McKay opened the meeting, held at the Ardsley Country Club, at 10:40 am.

Mary Jean Keenan said she had received a note of thanks from Carol Meszaros for the going-away luncheon held in her honor.

Minutes of the April 24, 1993 meeting were accepted as read. Minutes of the April 24, 1993 Annual Meeting were accepted as read.

Treasurer's Report - Mary Jean Keenan and Heather Kenny audited the books through the end of the past fiscal year.

# ARDWICKS BOARD MEETING December 11, 1993

Present: Bertchie, Bruce, Conner, Cowles, Glus, Keenan, Kenny and McKay

President McKay opened the meeting, held at the Ardsley Country Club, at 10:40 am.

Minutes of the November 10, 1993 meeting were read by the Secretary. Marcella Hanlon will not be responsible for cost of Empire State trophy boxes, the Secretary having found no record in past minutes that indicated this was proposed. Minutes were accepted.

Treasurer's Report - Jean Glus reported receipts of \$120.04 and disbursements of \$367.50, balance of \$1,689.65 as of 12/1/93. 100 Ardwick pins are on hand.

Question arose as to why we pay for pins and medals from our treasury. Chris Bertchie noted that since we are USWCA and not USCA we cannot enter teams in national competitions, but must go through Ardsley, St. Andrews, etc. It was noted this is since dues must be paid to USCA to enter their competitions and women's clubs are ineligible to join. Advisability of abandoning our entity as a club as well as the above issues was discussed and tabled, it being decided these are large issues that should not be altered hastily.

<u>USWCA</u> - Shirley Bruce announced we have been accepted for entry in the Senior Bonspiel (Jan. 20-23, Green Bay, WI) and Nationals (Feb. 10-13, at Broomstones). The latter may require playdowns, since more than 1 team might want to go.

Bonspiels - Heather Kenny announced receipt of the following invitations: Ottawa Ladies Crystal Pebble - Feb. 7-11, Tri-State Friendly at Nutmeg - Jan. 22, Bay State - Feb. 21-23 and Albany Challenge - March 17-20. Chris said it's possible 3 teams of night curlers might be interested in the Albany Challenge. Chris also reported on the Two Brooms held Dec. 9 at Nutmeg. Ardwicks lost 2, won 1 game. Many would prefer 8 rather than 10 ends for these games, and perhaps that will be considered in '93-'94, but we must be consistent for this year's other competition. Heather will consult redate in March (our 1st preference being the 11th, 2nd choice: 4th).

<u>Prizes</u> - Empire State Trophies need new boxes to accommodate plinth. Having it done where the trophies were purchased would be too costly. Mary Jean Keenan will ask Adam Chebetar to do the job.

Nadja expressed thanks to Shirley and Archie Bruce for our rosters.

Skips' Rep - Shirley will be meeting with the skips at noon today.

New Business - Chris announced she enjoyed taking part in the umpire school in Philadelphia past weekend. Discussions enabled her to determine a club was assembling packages for needy women and inspired the following motion: That we use the proceeds from the Silent Auction at today's luncheon to support "New Beginnings" and, perhaps if small, augment those funds with part of our treasury. Motion passed. It was also suggested that the annual St. Andrews Christmas Party might support a needy cause in lieu of "grab bag" prizes.
