"Court Sports" in Hawthorne (a fitness club) is being used as a vehicle for publicity. Open houses will be held at the Curling Club 5 days starting this Saturday. The Curling Club Board will be asked if we could have the proceeds from the next 2 years' Headless Horseman silent auction to defray costs. Estimated expenses are \$5,000. Pam suggested checking to see what's available in manufacturing companies' catalogues. Lillie suggested a NYS shaped pin with highlights of cities involved.
