RULES OF PLAY

The current USCA rules shall apply with the following exceptions and additions:

- A. Regarding substitutions, if your team's skip and vice skip are playing, your sub must play in the front end; using a curler who does not usually play in the front end as a sub in the front end, will result in a two stone handicap.
- B. Substitutes must be willing to play for any team that needs them without prejudice.
- Let In the true spirit of curling, the team skips must strive to keep the playing conditions fair for both teams, e.g., by trying to play with equally balanced teams, as well as the same ice conditions for each team.
- D. In the case of a tie, an extra end of one stone for each curler will be played to produce a winner; the winning team will be awarded the points for the extra stones that break the tie, but will not be awarded points for the extra end.
- E. The league chair will make the final determinations, including forfeitures and penalties.

a. Scoring a forfeit

For a game that is not played due to a forfeit, or in a game where the winning team has to forfeit, the team that gets the benefit of the forfeit will be awarded 20 points. In a game where the losing team has to forfeit, the winning team shall get the greater amount of their actual points scored in the game, or 20 points. In any case, the team that forfeits the game will be awarded no points.

ARDWICKS BOARD MEETING

December 11, 2003

Present: Pippa Broadhurst, Marion Cowles, Margaret Guiry, Mary Jean Keenan, Mary Lockhart and Jennifer Stannard.

The meeting was held at the Ardsley Curling Club and was called to order at 10:50 am.

Minutes of the October 7, 2003 meeting were accepted as read.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Jean Glus was unable to attend. Pippa reported that small bills have come in for Empire State. The Treasurer has not received any registrations for this event. Some Ardwicks still owe \$45 for participation in the Canadian Friendship Tour.

<u>Pins</u> - Pippa has researched cost of pins. Prices of duck winner and runner up for Empire States would be \$25. They, Wells Wicks and MacIntosh would total \$723.23 from Wayne Silversmiths. Chuck Owens has a source that might be more reasonable and has offered to redo some Ardwick pins.

Empire States 50th Anniversary Pin - Sell for , cost: \$6.65 per pin. One hundred have been ordered. 96 players will take part in the Empire State games and will receive a pin. Requests have come in to buy the pin. Jennifer moved that an additional 25 pins be ordered at a cost of \$162.50. Motion passed.

All American - 20 curlers are needed to participate. Thursday morning may not be able to make the quota. Mary said there are 16. She will try to encourage others to join. Men cannot be subs.

<u>Canadian Senior Women's Friendship Tour</u> - Jennifer has gotten word that the women had a wonderful time and thoroughly enjoyed the efforts put forth by their hosts.

Meeting was adjourned at noon.
