Hi Mary-

Here's the letter... I want to say that I would be perfectly happy to bag the whole ratings thing and go back to the old way - BUT, the skips would then take responsibility for getting subs. Or, we could play it both ways and have the skips all do the ranking and then they know who to call for subs. This would, of course, affect the 2nd to last paragraph of the letter.

The last line of the letter is tongue in cheek... I guess. I hate these politics and I now remember why I quit the league in the first place....

I am writing to give a little more background on the request for "ratings" for the Tuesday night women's curling league.

Last year, the league had some problems with the sub policy. There were issues with the position of the sub, and the penalty points to be assessed for skip subs. We are trying out a ratings system to try to clarify the policy and avoid similar issues.

Our policy is that any team member who cannot attend a certain night should call their own sub. An effort should be made to get a sub of the same level - but how do people, especially the newer members, know who is what level? We felt that this is one solution to try.

We realize that the thought of RATING may worry you, and we were concerned about people feeling that others were sitting in judgement. It does not need to be like this. Perhaps we should have called it SORTING, if you read Harry Potter.

The e-mail was sent to any women who skipped in the league last year or prior. If it was sent to you in error (that is, you will not be curling or subbing on Tuesday nights), please let us know in a reply and feel free to ignore it. We sent it early, in hopes of establishing the rules before the season, and also as an aid in balancing teams.

Completing the form should not take you a long time. In going down the list, just skip over anyone you do not know. For those you have curled with or against, your input is valuable. Please simply fill in the *position* you feel that person would play *in the Tuesday night league* (they might play a different position in a different league). For many, you may feel a range is appropriate - like "front end" or "2-3" or "3-4." This is fine. You can ignore the sweeping and comment columns.

Once we have your Sorting forms, we will compile a general list of the women and their position range. This general list would be available for reference when looking for subs.

We apologize for any confusion this may have caused. Please e-mail or call if you have concerns. However, realize that excessive complaining may lead to having the league dumped in your lap.



Mary, here are the comments I've received so far. As far as I'm concerned, this matter is in the hands of the Ardwick's.

Pete

I think this is a touchy subject. The board has never to my knowledge interfered with the men's rating system as a matter of fact I'm not sure if the men rate everyone or only Wednesday curlers. I don't think the board should be involved in how the women rate each other. I would suggest whomever spoke to you, speak to Ardwick's President.

I believe that the decision to rate all women came about because women who do not regularly curl on Tuesday night might be subbing at times. Problems that arose in the past were the result of this happening. You can't keep teams even if a very highly skilled sub is allowed to step in for a less seasoned player. There are skips who will pull in a ringer as the event gets toward the end, in order to maximize the ability of the team to win that event. That being said, and knowing that the women doing the rating do curl in multiple leagues and therefore do have knowledge of other curlers ability, I feel that rating everyone is a good idea.

Like Pete says keep this within the Board or someone could be made a scape goat for stating what they see as the truth.

While I acknowledge and commend the Tues night ladies for attempting to police themselves, and I generally think its a good idea... I agree with a couple of points with those who do not wish to be included in those ratings. The best way to explain, for me, is by example:

Lets say, Suzanne Niles comes in early on Mon night to practice. She glances at the bulletin board to find out that the Tuesday night ladies have ranked her very low.

She has never played or ever intends to play on Tues night, and only a handful of ladies even know who she is. What is the point of including her in the rankings? Why risk causing hard feelings. My opinion, is that if she requests that she be excluded from the rankings, then her name should be deleted. And certainly, the rankings should be available to the skips...not posted.

I like the idea that anyone who is not going to play on Tuesday can have them selves excluded from the rankings.

Katy's e-mail follows:

Hi everyone- My e-mail is kind of screwed up right now and I am not always able to log on. The reason for the ratings was, indeed, to try to avoid some sub

issues that caused - hmm, shall we say a RIFT among the women of the league, and several quit the league altogether. Including me.

People from outside the Tuesday night league are asked to sub. Because each person is expected to get their own subs, the thinking was that the ratings would be a cleaner way for people to find an appropriate sub. We were therefore thinking that the list would be made to each team, but not really posted on the bulletin board.

People could certainly opt out of being rated. Another possibility we were considering is for people to have to register as subs, and then only list those ratings with the sub list, but there are many times when the sub list is depleted and people look outside anyway.

People who have skipped on Tuesdays in the past (or people we thought might have - we didn't want to leave people out) were asked to do the ratings. These ratings should be done with the Tuesday league in mind. Because the Tuesday league is generally less competitive than other nights, I would think that people might be rated higher than they expect, if anything.

That being said, this ratings request went out before I thought it was going to. I don't know how many of you saw it, but it needed more explanation than was really given, and we were planning to send out a follow-up with more explanation once we had all met about the women's leagues on Wednesday.

ARDWICKS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

October 6, 2004

The meeting was held at the Ardsley Country Club. The President called the meeting to order at 12:50 pm.

Minutes of the April 20, 2004 Annual Meeting were accepted as read.

Treasurer's Report - Jean Glus reported additional expenses to her report as follows:

With these additions the balance as stated in the checking account as of 4/12/04 is \$7,817.82.

League Rules - Pursuant to the request of Ardsley Curling Club President Pete McCuen, Richard Kilsheimer has reviewed the curling rules in an attempt to devise a template for standardizing rules for all leagues. The Executive Board reviewed the proposed rules and made the following decisions for changes from the proposed rules for the Ardwick's. The changes to apply to the Ardwick's are underlined.

Page 4 - 5. Substitutes - b. Men's and Women's Leagues: Strike (i) and insert the Alternative Proposal as b.(i) with the addition of the last word of the paragraph to read "second/vice."

Next paragraph - "Discussion" - Strike the last sentence "I found...."

(ii) Change to "In the Ladies' League, penalty point list of players will be established before the commencement of play consisting of "skips", as evaluated by the league chair and the senior skips of that league. Any substitute from the penalty point list shall cause a one-point penalty "if they are the 2nd skip level player on that team." A penalty-point person...."

Page 6 - 6. Tardiness - If a qualified rink....ready to play within "15" minutes ...by one end will occur for each "15" minutes thereafter...

Page 7 - 7. Pace of Play. Strike "At one hour and thirty-five minutes after the scheduled start time of the match, the teams may complete the end that they are currently playing, plus one more end."

Our goal is to create fair and balanced teams and to promote good fellowship and friendly competition for the sport of curling.

Open Houses - October 19, 20, 23, 24. Mary encourages members to take part. She will try to attend.

Ice Schedule - Prepared by Rich Andrechak distributed.

General Meeting and "Kick Off" - November 2, Tuesday evening - 6:30 pm - Light food and pick up game. Donna Purkey has offered training Tuesday evenings and Thursday mornings, schedule to be worked out.

Curtains - Mary announced they are a work in progress.

Ardwick's Fall Letter - Mary will send out a letter informing members of women's bonspiels and "kick off" plans.

USWCA - Pippa Broadhurst is now our representative. Jennifer Stannard continues on as Nutmeg representative. Donna Purkey is the USWCA liaison to the USCA. Pippa attended a meeting in Milwaukee September 23-26. Vote decided against allowing men to participate in the Women's Challenge. Pippa distributed a list of upcoming Women's Bonspiels. The first Ladies' Bonspiel of the season, the Carosella, will take place November 4-7 in Schenectady. The Empire State will return to 4 events. If playdowns are needed, ice time will be worked out with Rich Andrechak. There must be 20 players for league play qualifying for All American competition. If the numbers are not there, evening and daytime curlers would have to combine to form one league. The Women's Challenge continues to grow as a popular event.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:40 pm.

Curlers play to win but never to humble their opponents. A true curler would prefer to lose rather than win unfairly.

A good curler never attempts to distract an opponent or otherwise prevent him/her from playing his/her best.

No curler ever deliberately breaks a rule of the game or any of its traditions. But, if he/she should do so inadvertently and be aware of it, he/she is the first to divulge the breach.

While the main objective of the game is to determine the relative skills of the players, the spirit of the game demands good sportsmanship, kindly feeling and honorable conduct. This spirit should influence both the interpretation and application of the rules of the game and also the conduct of all participants on and off the ice."
