

Welcome to the Tenth annual MacIntosh!

The MacIntosh, named for our own dear Jean MacIntosh, the hardest working woman in curling, is an event dedicated to the development of curling, by fostering new skips. Our junior skip event has a special format, namely putting non-skips at skip, and the skips at vice, in a teaching position. Due to the event's special nature, it requires special accommodations, in order to maintain a fair playing field.

- 1. If a team needs a substitute in the skip position, they must first ask the skip of the bye team. If she is not available, the vice of the team needing the sub may skip, resulting in 2 balance points (the object is to balance teams, not penalize them) awarded to the opposition; the balance points will be posted on the scoreboard prior to the start of the game, using the red back of the #9. The lead or second may move to skip without adding points.
- 2. Any sub may play her own position on another team, maintaining the team balance. A skip or vice playing in the front end (lead or second) will give the opposition 1 balance point subbing for the second, 2 points subbing for the lead, and loss of the first end hammer for both.
- 3. If a front end curler is absent, and the team must play with only three members, this will unbalance the teams. To correct this imbalance, the team with three will cede 2 rocks and the hammer in the first end to the other team. No balance necessary if the skip or vice is absent.
- 4. All games will be win/lose. Tied games will be decided by skip's rocks, with sweeping (one rock each skip). A team may concede at any time during the game. If two or more teams have tied records at the end of the competition, the tie breaker will be head to-head records.
- 5. Timing Teams must stant at 7.380 if three players are present. If only two players are present by 7.40, the date team will be assessed 1 rock and 1 end, for each 10 minutes of delay. The game will be reduced by the number of ends assessed. At 9:20 the end you are playing will be the last end for all games.

The MacIntosh is an event which answers the call of the true spirit of curling. This spirit demands good sportsmanship, friendliness, and honorable conduct. Have fun, everyone!

TWO BROOMS EVENT

A competition between the Ardwicks and the Nutmeg Women Curlers to promote good curling.

The competition consists of one daytime and one evening draw. The clubs will alternate hosting the daytime and evening draws each season.

RULES:

- 1. The Chairs need to agree on the 2 dates of the competition and the number of teams that will play. Two weeks beforehand, the HOST chair will remind the GUEST chair of the date.
- 2. The daytime game will commence at 10 AM with coffee, etc, being served at 9:30 AM. The evening game will commence at 7:30 PM, or at a time mutually agreed upon by the two clubs, with refreshments being served by the host club.
- 3. The games will be 8 ends.
- 4. Free Guard Zone Rule will be in effect.
- 5. A person may play in both games, but only play SKIP in one.
- 6. A curler playing SKIP in one game shall not throw last rocks in the other.
- 7. In an emergency, a visiting team with only three players may request a substitute to curl as LEAD.
- 8. The team match-ups will be drawn by the Skips of each Club just prior to the game.
- 9. The VICE-SKIPS will toss a coin, and the winner will choose between the hammer or going first. Color is pre-determined (see rule 10).
- 10. The visiting teams shall be assigned the top of the scoreboard.
- 11. The names of the team members will be recorded on the score card.
- 12. After the game, the HOST chair will prepare a report and provide a copy to the GUEST chair.
- 13. **SCORING:** for every game, record on the score sheet:
 - a. Win or Loss
 - b. Number of Ends won
 - c. Total Stones
 - d. Ties to be determined by an extra end <u>credit for win only</u>, not the end, nor the stones scored in that end
- 14. **THE WINNER** is the Club with the most games won. If games won is tied, then winner is determined by the total of ends won. If ends won is tied, then winner is determined by the highest score (stone count).

The Two Brooms Trophy goes to the winning Club to be engraved and held until the following season.

HISTORY: This competition began in 1971 between the Ardsley Ladies Curling Club, Nutmeg Women Curlers and Westchester Wicks, under the name Ard-Nut-Wick. It was renamed Three Brooms on October 6, 1972. Revisions to the rules were made in the 1978-9 season, in January 1986 and on June 8, 1989 after the Ardsley Ladies Curling Club and the Westchester Wicks merged as one club under the name Ardwicks. At this time, the evening curlers were brought into the Three Brooms. At some point between 1991 and 1997, it was renamed Two Brooms.
