Dear *Jean*,

On behalf of the Westchester Wicks, I am writing to you to solicit your Club's opinions on the following matters.

In our contacts over the past few years with other Ladies Curling Clubs in the Eastern Area of the USWCA we have found that many times, matters that concerned us were also a problem to them.

The most important of these is the scheduling of ladies bonspiels in our area. Other matters of concern included techniques of membership recruitment, maintaining membership interest and a general feeling that there was no one person or committee that the East could turn to in the USWCA whose assignment and first concern were problems in our area, how to help solve them and finally, to realize that within the context of the USWCA each area faces a different set of circumstances in some instances.

As dues paying members of the USWCA, which was formed as an Umbrella Organization to support and foster ladies curling in the United States, we feel that area co-ordinators whose responsibilities to their member clubs were more widely delineated so that these clubs could be assured of not only advice and service but that any matter that could not be dealt with by the Area Director would be referred to the correct body within the USWCA for suggestions as to what course to pursue.

Be assured that we are not advocating an abrogation of any club's individual practices, privileges or responsibilities, rather we^{as} that the USWCA provide the services of an Area Director who would be empowered to give advice, service and co-ordination when called upon or when she notes a problem developing. In line with this we suggest that, since the four areas are so diverse in many aspects, meetings of area representatives be held prior to the usual representatives meeting.

If possible we would appreciate hearing from you regarding the above before the February meeting in Cleveland. If there is enough positive response a meeting of Eastern Reps could be held there.

BOARD MEETING

Monday, January 24th, 1983

The regular monthly meeting was held at the home of Jean MacIntosh, President, at 10:00 A.M.

Present were members: Whitley, MacIntosh, Heath, Smith, Wells, Eager, Garred, Patterson, Noble and Doonan.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A discussion took place on the use of the ice and warm room by other than the Thursday Night Group. It was stated once more that clearance should be obtained through Ed Seibert, Bunky Harmon will be told to have his monthly meeting on Feb. 17th some other place as this is the date set for the Fun Night.

The Treasurer, Claire Noble, reported \$515.57 in the bank and in addition \$15 in contingency fees. Four members still owe fees.

Fran recounted how our team fared in the Empire State Bonspiel. She reported that we were asked if we would be interested in becoming co-hosts at future Empire State Bonspiels as they would like to increase the number of hosts from the present three to six, each host to enter two teams and have the event at their club every fourth year. In the discussion that followed it was mentioned that the Empire State is a fixed event and conflicts with our Mixed Bonspiel. Marilyn urged that we meet with the other clubs to coordinate our bonspiels. It is good that ours is a late one in March. The possibility of co-hosting at the Empire and having a fun match with St. Andrews at the same time at home so ^{two} teams could go away was debated. Jane and Fran thought there was no point in sending two teams to one place. Jean requested that Fran or Marilyn discuss it with Diane Mojo of St. Andrews before the meeting on Feb 14th and before we arrive at a decision.

Difficulties with getting subs was brought up since Jinnie Hill and Ellie Blake have back trouble. Fran said that two regular team members make the game legal ^{plus} one sub. Other possibilities ^{at solving the problem} are five on a team (four playing) or cutting down on the number of teams. Marilyn suggested that the sports committee make recommendations for next year for the board to pass on as to how we can handle this problem, the recommendations then to be put in writing and sent to all members.

Margaret reported that she was unable to get up a team to go to Broomstones.

Marilyn is unable to go to the USWCA meeting in Cleveland. Jane will try to go to represent us. Two proxies are to be sent in and it was agreed that one be mailed in to the secretary and the other be taken by Jane or given to St. Andrews with instructions as to how to vote for us.

they Marilyn explained the present system of allotting spaces for the USWCA Bonspiel. Those clubs sending good faith money had their membership added to ^{the total count} for their area, and ^{the total count} ~~and~~ ^{On this basis} were assigned spaces even though the money was not needed and they might not be sending a team. A letter from Ann Winslow, Eastern representative at the Assn. referred to this method favorably but Marilyn does not feel it fair. Neither does Jo

Owens of Nutmeg whose letter she read to the Board. A motion was made and passed that ^{we would like} spaces for our area ^{to} be based on the membership of the clubs and not on good faith money ~~to~~ ^{to advise the USWCA}.

Carol Ryan sent in a report of three new members. Day curlers attention will be called to the sign-up sheet for the get-together on Feb. 17th as it seems to have been overlooked by most.

Jean read a letter from Marcella Hanson of the Westchester Wicks. asking for our opinion on the need for an eastern ~~USWCA~~ co-ordinator to schedule ladies bonspiels and resolve problems that are particular to the east. No such service presently exists. Meetings of area representatives could be held before the National annual meeting. Ann Winslow is co-ordinator for the National Bonspiel only. A motion was made and passed that we follow the suggestions outlined in M. Hanlor's letter of which a copy is herein attached.

Jane reported on the progress of our Ladies Bonspiel. Someone is needed to do the breakfasts. Teresa will be asked. Jean thought we should have a playdown for the team we enter. One team is signed up, Margaret will get up a second team. Marilyn is taking charge of the luncheons, Jean and Anita having the dinner parties with the hope of getting Ann McCray to host a third as possibly there will be 90 guests. Seventeen members so far are having the guests overnight. It was decided that arriving teams go to either Anita's or the clubhouse (what to be decided later) for their reception on Monday night between the hours of seven and nine and where their hosts would meet them. Alice is in charge of the prizes, Bette and Ruth Russell the kits, Bobbie the signs and draw sheets, Fran the warm room hostesses and referees. Anita, treasurer, will also see to bar supplies. It was agreed that bar tenders were needed. Possibly the referees can serve. The dinner-theater on Wed. night will be \$25 and the deadline for signing up with check is Feb. 9th.

Jean reported that Sirkka had bowed out of chairing the lunches for the Men's International but might serve with a co-chairman. George Shirk will be asked if he would like to have them catered.

Jean made a suggestion in regard to prizes. We might get them early in the year at special discount places where nice items can be obtained inexpensively if bought in quantity.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 12:05.

The next meeting will take place on February 21.

REVISED RULES FOR USWCA SPONSORED INTRA-CLUB ALL-AMERICAN EVENT
1982

1. Each club shall have a minimum entry of 4 rinks. If deemed necessary, clubs may set their own maximum number of entrants. An entry of four to seven rinks should curl a round-robin to determine a winner. An entry of eight or more rinks may curl in a bracketed elimination (kill-down), or a round-robin, or some combination thereof; whatever their ice schedule permits.
2. The winning team must play a minimum of 3 games. A "bye" is considered a game and a win.
3. All games shall be 10 ends. An extra end will be played to break a tie; one or two rocks per player will be at the discretion of the individual clubs.
4. The current USWCA Rules of the Game (USWCA Handbook of Rules and Regulations) shall apply with the following exceptions and additions:
 - A. Forfeiture rules and substitution of players shall be determined by the individual clubs.
 - B. In bracketed eliminations (kill-downs), all initial pairings shall be done by drawing "out of a hat".
 - C. If possible, there shall be no more than one club-rated skip on a rink in any game. Each club shall determine who shall be eligible as the other 3 members of the rink. Should it be necessary to place a second skip on a rink she shall play lead.
5. This Event shall be independent of the USWCA Annual Bonspiel and the U.S. Championship and shall:
 - A. Not be used as a consolation event for those unable to compete in our Annual Bonspiel or Championship.
 - B. Not be used as a playdown for our Annual Bonspiel or Championship.
6. The All-American shall be independent of any other club competition.
7. The USWCA provides for award pins for the team winning the All-American Event.

Upon completion of the All-American Event at your club, send the following information to the USWCA All-American Event Chairman.

- A. Name of club.
- B. Complete names (typed or printed) and positions played by members of the winning team. (example: Mrs. Jane Smith - not Mrs. Harold A. Smith).
- C. Number of teams entered from your club.
- D. How the event was played at your club (i.e. bonspiel, round-robin, league, etc.)
- E. Any comments or suggestions you have for the event.

Board Meeting

Monday, February 21, 1983

In the absence of the President, Jean MacIntosh, the meeting was held at the home of Fran Garred, Vice President at 10:00 A.M.

Present were members : Garred, Eager, Fletcher, Whitman, Whitley, Heath, Doonan and Wells.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was read by Fran. The balance on hand of this date is \$705.88. All contingency fees are in.

Fran reported that Margaret Smith had had difficulties in getting up a second team for a playdown with Teresa's team for our entry in our Ladies' Bonspiel. A discussion followed in which the opinion was expressed that often members might like to play but need someone to ask them and that in the future we should make a greater effort to get other teams signed up for playdowns. Fran pointed out, however, that it was a problem to get people who could curl two days in a row. Fran said she would have substitutes available each day of our Bonspiel.

Anita's motion that Jane be reimbursed fully, including airfare, for her trip to the USWCA meeting in Cleveland as our representative was unanimously passed.

Fran called attention to the fact that it was time for the Nominating Committee to select a slate for next year. Jean MacIntosh will be apprised of this when she returns. Jeanne Hefner is Chairman following Jinny Hill's resignation.

Jane reported on the USWCA meeting. Shirley Elwell of the USWCA is available to make up draws for bonspiels if needed. Regarding the training of new members it was recommended that they be given a course at the beginning of the season and again midway. The Board did not think the latter feasible. Jane also reported on suggestions for a rating system of curlers. One method would be for team members to rate each other after a game, a second method would be for the skips to rate their team. This would make it easier for the curling committee to make up teams, however neither idea appealed to the Board. Jane also reported that the Senior Bonspiel had been a great success in its initial year. Another item from the meeting is a change in the rules for the All-American event. A club now may choose to require either eight or ten ends for a game. In playdowns before championship bonspiels, however, there still has to be ten ends. Regarding the matter of co-hosting the Empire State there is no rush for us to make a decision.

Fran reported that the Thursday Night Ladies' party was very nice. There were two sheets playing six ends.

Sirkka reported that we came in second at the conclusion of the Three Brooms, only losing by one ~~point~~ win.

Marilyn urged as a good idea for the next curling chairman that that the events for the coming season be planned during the summer and ~~have them~~ decided before September. The Three Brooms chairman will know when those events are to take place. Anita suggested that we go back to an opening lunch, ~~which~~ ^{was} thought a good idea.

Fran suggested that the All-American not be two days in a row and that we have just three events; the Icebreaker, Wells Wicks and All-American. It was strongly felt that teams who had played together ^{before} as a rink should not play as a rink in the All-American. Marilyn made the point that a two day All-American would provide members with experience in two day bonspiels. It was decided that the curling committee should discuss and make recommendations on this.

Jane gave the Board an update on the arrangements for the coming Ladies bonspiel. It was decided that we would serve cheese strada and salad for lunch on Tues., quiche Lorraine and salad on wed., and soup and sandwiches on Thurs. We will charge \$4 as previously. Jane spelled out the duties of the referees and warm room hostesses. Hostesses may attend the dinner parties Tues. night but it will cost them \$10. Marilyn's plaid cosmetic cases with Fran's painted emblemen were much admired.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at around 11:00 A.M.

The next meeting will take place on March 21st.

Jean announced that the Nominating Committee had made up the slate of officers for next year as follows; Carol Meszaros for first Vice-President, Claire Noble, second Vice-President, Doris Garrison, Treasurer, and Faye Beadle, Secretary.

Fran described her plans for our last day of curling, this Wednesday, the 23rd. Curlers will be divided into red and blue teams with two three end games and one four end to make it a round robin. Jean suggested that the question of playoffs be included as to whether curlers preferred it scheduled for a certain date or ~~to~~ leave the date up to the two skips to be accomplished within a certain time limit.

The house cleanup is scheduled for April 4th at 9:00 A.M.

Bobbie will be in charge of the May luncheon which will take place at Jean's on Thursday, May 5th. She and Jean will confer on the menu.

The Board agreed with Anita's suggestion that the Fall Luncheon meeting be held at the Club. The tentative date is Friday, October 28th, this to be checked out with the Club.

A motion made by Anita that we decline joining St. Andrews in co-hosting the Empire State Bonspiel on the basis that our rules allow only one team away at a time was passed unanimously. The Board is of the opinion that it would not only be of no advantage to us but would entail a great deal of work.

Bette will try to make up a list of appropriate curling rules. She mentioned that the calendar of events needed ~~needed~~ to be started this summer.

Anita reported that 18 or 19 prospective members had come to the Open House yesterday, ^{March 20th} but no separatelady curlers.

It was mentioned that the crystal prizes awarded at our Ladies Bonspiel were terrific. Jean brought up the question of going in with the Mixed curlers and other groups on buying prizes in quantity but it was felt that in our case it was not necessary as we award pins.

Jane said she had received thirteen thank-you notes from clubs who had participated in our Bonspiel. The visitors thought the co-operation of our members in housing them and otherwise play-

ing hostess to them was wonderful and they enjoyed getting to know so many of us. Jane said she had sent thank-you notes to Fran Smith and other non curling helpers. She said also that the clubs had expressed appreciation for the exceptional program and that was what had drawn them to enter. The Board gave Jane a rousing vote of thanks for the great success which we all enjoyed.

Anita who had been treasurer of the event said we had made over \$400.

Jean requested ^{that} all committee members ~~to~~ prepare a report of their yearly duties for the benefit of successors.

Claire will be in charge of the calendar for next year and will work on it over the summer with Bette and Carol.

Jean agreed to move the date of the monthly meetings back to the first Monday of the month.

On the subject of new business the need for a new carpet strip for both sides of the ice was brought up. A motion was made that Marilyn Eager ^{and Anita} be asked to look into it. It was also suggested that we buy a new telephone to be jacked in to the ice area during play. The subject of a dumbwaiter to carry up food from the kitchen was discussed with no solution to the placement thereof.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:25.
