## ARDSLEY LADIES CURLING BOARD MEETING Monday, April 16, 1984

The regular monthly meeting was held at the home of Jean MacIntosh, President. Members present were: Doonan, Eager, Fletcher, Garred, MacIntosh, Meszaros, Noble, Patterson, and Walker.

Diane Mojo of the Westchester Wicks was present for the first part of the meeting. Jean MacIntosh read a letter previously received from Mrs. Mojo suggesting an increase in the number of New York Ladies Curling Clubs which sponsor the Empire State Bonspiel. Present sponsors are Schenectady, Utica, and the Westchester Wicks. Ardsley and Albany are the only other New York State Clubs which may become sponsors. Mrs. Mojo spoke briefly, outlining the background of the Empire State Bonspiel and describing how it is run. Dates for this year have not been established, but it is usually held around the middle of Janurary. If we join as a sponsor, we will be responsible for running the event every fourth year. If Albany also joins, we will then be responsible every fifth year. At this point, Mrs. Mojo left the meeting.

The minutes of the March meeting were read and approved. Marilyn pointed out that since the USWCA has not as yet returned our plate, we are unable to place our advertisement for next year. She will write once again to the USWCA.

The treasurer's report showing a balance of \$1,614.33 was read and approved.

Carol reported on the member-guest bonspiel, which was quite successful. She also reported on the Wells-Wick competition. The Wednesday winning rink, skipped by Sirrka Whitman, lost in a close match to the Thursday winning rink, skipped by Theresa Welch.

A discussion followed as to how many points should be given for a forfeited game. It was moved by Marilyn and seconded by Bobby that we include in the rules a penalty of 12 points for a forfeited game.

Carol then reported on a meeting held on Monday, April 2nd, at her home. Ardsley was represented by Carol, Fran, Marilyn, and Bobby. The Westchester Wicks were represented by Jackie Grant, Marcella Hanlon, Marita Smith, and Molly Babcock. The purpose of the meeting was to explore the possibility of some joint curling between the two clubs. This would improve the level of curling and make scheduling easier. The logistics of the schedule will be worked out by the clurling chairmen, and Bobby and Marita will meet during the summer to discuss rules. It was moved, seconded, and motion carried that a four or five week competition called "The Ardwick" be held on Thursdays beginning the last week in October, using Ardsley ice. If this is successful, a second joint competition will be held later in the year, perhaps at St. Andrews. This proposal will be presented to the members at the May meeting.

Jean mentioned that, as a gesture of appreciation for having used our ice this past year, the Westchester Wicks gave us a package containing four bottles of liquor. This will be raffled off at the Fundspiel.

After discussion, it was moved by Marily and seconded by Carol that we join with the New York State Clubs in sponsoring the Empire State Bonspiel on a rotating basis. This proposal will also be presented to the members at the May meeting.

A tentative schedule for the 1984-85 season was drawn up as follows:

Ardwick Competition and regular Wednesday curling -- October 31/ November 1 through December 5/6 (no curling November 21/22)

Wells Wicks Competition -- December 12/13 through January 23/24 (no curling December 26/27)

All American Competition -- January 30/31

Ardwick Competition and regular Wednesday curling (or Thursday, if Ardwick is held on Wednesdays) -- February 6/7 through February 27/28

Final event -- March 6/7 through March 20/21

Special Events: Three Brooms will be held in December. Member-guest bonspiel will be held early in March.

It was moved by Carol and seconded by Anita that a scrapbook be purchased to hold old newspaper clippings etc.

Bobby suggested that the chair cushions be covered in eight different designs representing the emblems of Ardsley, St. Andrews, New York Caledonia, Mutmeg, Beaver Dam, Plainfield, Lake Placid, and Morfolk. She will do further research into the cost involved.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 AM.
