She also asked for and received permission from the Board for our Co-Presidents Bobbie Patterson and Shirley Bruce to write supporting letters for Peggy Rotton's nomination to be the second Vice President of the USWCA.

Hospitality: Heather Kenny and Jan Conner were thanked for their excellant work this year.

<u>Publicity</u>: Jean MacIntosh was out of town. Marcella Hanlon suggested a news letter be put together and sent to our associates who have been so supportive - this includes excurlers from both clubs.

Ardwick Pins: Shirley Bruce reported on the price quote from Sandi Buchanan's mother for the newly designed ARDWICK pins. The consensus was for the 1 1/4 " pin and that we should have a sample sent to us before putting an order in, which would be a large one. Shirley, Marcella Hanlon and Carol Meszaros were entrusted to che k the sample which will arive during the summer months. If ok, and ordered then, we should have the pins by October, in plenty of time for our curling season.

Senior Bonspiel: Shirley Bruce agreed to chair the event, with the promise of full support from every member of the Ardwicks. Jinny Hill will - ASAP - contact the Dinner Theater about reservations for our group.

New Business

Shirley Bruce brought up the condition of the Ladies Room in the Curling Club and received agreement from the board that it was a disgrace. The Board of the Curling Club will be asked to help, we will put up \$100 toward tile and indoor/outdoor carpeting and get to work and redo it.

Clean-up day, for the kitchen area and behind the curtain, was set for Wednesday, April 10 at 10 am.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 12:30 and the members joined the rest of the Ardwicks at the closing luncheon.
