Nadja reiterated one day a week curling will have to come to pass, Thursdays being particulary sparce and difficult for medal events. A questionnaire listing options, including afternoon curling, will be distributed before the end of the curling season. A sign-up sheet for the next event will be presented soon.

Bonspiels Shirley Bruce reported Nutmeg had 2 wins and Ardwicks 1 win at the December 6 3 Brooms. Chris Bertchie is assembling teams for the February 13 event.

Candlewicks attended Plainfield friendly but not Silver Belles.

Ardwick's Empire State team: M.J. Keenan, C. Meszaros, K. Mudge and N. Clancy. Marlene Verdes subbed on the Philadelphia team. USWCA Senior team (January 19-21): S. Bruce, J. Hill, M. Hanlon and M. Babcock. No other bonspiels have teams represented to date. Shirley encouraged participation at Bay State, since TCC regularly supports our ESB. A Sweetheart of a 'Spiel, scheduled by Nutmeg for February 18 & 19 has been cancelled. Announcing events before our regular curling and reminding people to check our bulletin board will hopefully have some positive results.

Empire State Bonspiel Annual Meeting Nadja presided and Shirley took minutes for this meeting held January 12 at Marcella Hanlon's home. Utica will hold next year's ESB over a weekend - January 8-10 having least conflicts. Shirley is trying to work out a rotation for awarding of trophies and medals, since that agreed upon last year has proved to be unworkable. Nadja has updated 2 ESB books - one that travels to the host club and one for ourselves - that contain pertinent information.

Rules Marita Smith noted the rule not to stop a stone before it comes to a full stop needs to be reinforced. She will find an appropriate picture to post on the bulletin board.

Prizes Carol Meszaros said she has enough Wells Wicks and All American pins. ESB pins must be ordered for this and next year and she must start from scratch - the former maker is out of business. It was decided enough pins should be ordered to cover '92, '93 and '94 needs. Shirley showed pins bought for past presidents at cost of \$27. Nominating Jan Conner's committee will meet shortly. Names were suggested for slots to be filled.

Memorials Marita announced Connie Marsh's husband had died. It was voted we send \$25. in his memory to the American Diabeties Society. It was suggested guidelines be set for similar situations. Discussion was tabled.

Empire State Bonspiel Ginny thanked Nadja and everyone for their work on this successful event. Nadja reiterated with her thanks. Nadja distributed copies of Budget-Actual Comparisons and it was reviewed. It was voted to donate \$50. to the Westchester Boys Choir as a thank you to a friend of Nadja's who contributed favors (perfume). Total reimbursements to individuals who incurred expenses were read. Some do not expect reimbursement. It was moved, seconded and passed that a Tiffany silver frame be given to Kathy Mudge in appreciation for the use of her home and donation of wine for the banquet. Marcella will purchase and send. Marlene Verdes' expenses for 3 trays of chicken and salad greens should come from ESB profits. Apple pins' cost will be deducted from ESB profits.

Junior Skips Pin Carol asked if there should be a pin for this event. Carol and Ginny will pursue suggestion offerred by Marcella for design. There will be one winner this year, using 3 Brooms scoring.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:45 pm.

ARDWICKS BOARD MEETING at Ardsley Country Club April 11, 1992

President Jinny Hill called the meeting to order at 10:45 a.m. Present were Bertchie, Bruce, Conner, Glus, Hanlon, Meszaros, Patterson & Smith.

Secretary's Report - Minutes of the previous meeting accepted as read.

Treasurer's Report - Accepted, with one corrections, as presented. Balance as of 3/6/92, Bonspiel Account, \$565.73; General fund, \$404.78; total balance \$970.51. Copy of report on file with Secretary.

Jinny Hill reported several ladies still have not paid their dues, and phone calls have been made to them. The Constitution and By-Laws states that "annual dues for renewing Active and Associate membership shall be due and payable in full by December 1st, and for new Active members by January 1st." This will henceforth be stated on the dues bill.

A resolution was passed"that Associate members who have not paid their \$5.00 dues, will be billed the following year with a notice that they will be dropped from membership if they do not bring dues up to date".

Home Sports - Nadja tabled reading her report until the Annual meeting as it ties in with the awards. Copy on file with Annual minutes.

Nadja has prepared a draft of a questionnaire which, when finalized, will to out to all day curlers, with replies to C. Meszaros by May 1st.

It was suggested that next season, a few minutes be taken before going on the ice, perhaps once a month, for a refresher on rules & regs.

Rules - Marita had no report.

Prizes - Carol brought Board up to date on pins purchased as awards, and the die that had to be struck for the ESB Duck & Duckling award pins as previous supplier out of business.

Bonspiel Report - Shirley tabled reading report. Copy of report on file with Secretary.

Skips Rep Report - Bobbie reported a Skips meeting was held and that Shirley Bruce is the new Skips Rep.

USWCA REP - Shirley read report on business conducted at USWCA Reps and Board of Directors meeting held in Duluth, MN, Feb. 3 & 4, 1991. She attended reps meeting for Marcella. Copy report on file with Secretary.

Mospitality - Bobbie reported that members made reservations for 30, but there were several mix-ups with Country Club. She suggested, and it was agreed, that from now on requests for reservations to to Hospitality Chairman who will then make all the reservations with the Country Club.

It was suggested that the Hospitality Chairman Mave a Co, or appoint a committee as job also involves 'house' i.e. curling club paper supplies, etc.

Lunch for annual meeting will cost \$14.95 plus 15% gratuity and 6-3/4% tax for a total of \$18.35

Publicity - Jean Glus reported an article in the Westchester County Convention Center's publication.

It was suggested that Jean appoint a helper who may then be willing to take over another year.

Curling Club future - Nadja brought the Board up to date on curling status as it related to Ardsley and St. Andrews Country Clubs and the curling clubs. Both Ardsley and St. Andrews Country Clubs seem to be procrastinating, so a group has been formed to look into other options. This group will be incorporated as Westchester Curling Club and will be the body that will manage a new curling facility if this comes to pass, and will handle the fund raising for same. The present clubs curling a Ardsley would pay ice fees to WCC Inc and would continue to curl under their present club names. One possibility being explored is Westchester Community College in Valhalla which has an unused ice rink on premises with also vacant property which could perhaps be arranged for our uses. Also a request has been made to Resolution Trust for a list of all property available in New York and Connecticut (they unfortunately do not break down by county). This group handles property taken over by banks, are depressed, etc.

Empire State Bonspiel - Madja reported that all materials from the Empire State have been assembled, including her final report, and compiled into a booklet for the Ardwicks and one for the 'travelling' file that travels between Ardwicks, Utica and Schenectady. Also that Nadja, Marcella and Shirley will weed out unnecessary info from 'old' files.

Candlewicks - C. Bertchie reported appreciation that USWCA will now award All American pins to both day & evening curlers thus avoiding a very difficult problem in scheduling playdowns between day and evening winners.

She will take on the Chairmanship for another year.

She requested that Nadja add to her questionnaire a request for day curlers to sign up if willing to sub on evening teams, and visa versa.

Also reported that Cindy Boss is organising a report of food costs for each event run this past season.

New Business - Jinny Hill reported and showed three scarf ties which have been purchased as gifts to departing members. Unfortunately we are losing Sue White and Joan Morrison who will be returning to Scotland, and Faith Lundgren may be moving just too far to be able to continue with us. They will all be missed.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:35p.m.
