ARDWICK BOARD MEETING

January 23, 1993

Present: Bertchie, Bruce, Cowles, Conner, Glus, Hanlon, Keenan,
MacIntosh, McKay and Meszaros

President McKay opened the meeting held at the Ardsley Country Club at 10:40 am.

Minutes of the November 7, 1992 meeting were accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Reports for November and December, 1992 were distributed. It was noted that 2 years' worth of Empire State pins were expensed in the December report. It was also noted that Empire State pins are not reimbursed by Ardsley Curling Club, as are events within our club. Pins need to be purchased for Candlewick and day events this year. It was agreed a fund raiser is needed. Carole Meszaros volunteered to oversee an auction to take place at the closing luncheon. Nadja reported that after the Ardsley Curling Club Board Meeting of January 17th she was approached with the request that the Ardwick contribute towards the cost of carpeting the entrance-way of the curling club. Since the purchase of a pebbler (and our commitment of \$200) is not coming about, we could comply.

Marcella Hanlon suggested yearly budgets be prepared. Chris Bertchie moved a Budget Committee be formed consisting of the Ardwick President, the Candlewick Representative and the Treasurer. Motion passed.

Regular and Associate Members who have not paid their dues were noted. They will again be reminded or dropped from membership.

Empire State Bonspiel Annual Meeting - Nadja reported the weekend time frame was well accepted (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) and Schenectady wants to do same next year. Our board agreed we'd like to use the weekend too, when it's our turn, if Ardsley Curling Club will agree to give us the time slots.

Home Sports - Carol announced winners of the Ice Breaker: First - Jinny Hill's team; tied for second - Shirley Bruce and Mary Jean Keenan's teams. Snow cancelled the All American last Tuesday. Carole will reschedule February 2 (first choice) or January 27th, depending on players' availability. She will repost the missing schedule on 2 bulletin boards. Wells Wicks will run 4 weeks after All American and Junior Skips, with winners determined on a point basis, the last 2 weeks of the season.

Chris noted the Candlewicks' need for more skips and that their present scheduling encourages people to play various positions. She distributed copies of rosters, teams and schedules. "Flame" competition produced the following winners: Skip - Carol Meszaros, Vice - Ann MacMillan, Second - Terry Crandall, Lead - Lilly Shortridge. Four pins are needed.

Two Brooms - Chris reported Nutmeg prefers later in the season. She will set up evening competition for Feb. 25 (first choice) or March 18 if they agree.

Women's Challenge - Chris looks for 2 more women to complete second team to go to Utica March 11th for competition for curlers with 5 years or less experience.

Prizes - Mary Jean Keenan praised Balfour for getting all the Empire State awards in on time! Marcella transferred All American pins to Mary Jean, who will have them engraved with this year's date. Marcella spoke of a competition held by Westchester Wicks whereby pins would be rotated weekly to winners of a senior and junior ladder. Winners at the end of the season would have their names engraved on a plaque. Nadja suggested this might be a good idea for next year's Ice Breaker. Carol suggested this event be shortened to 3 or 4 weeks instead of 6. It was also suggested the same format take place in the evening.

Empire State Bonspiel - Shirley said Undine Fiedler's Schenectady team won the First Event. She read the names of all winners and passed the list to Mary Jean for engraving trophies.

Senior Women's Bonspiel - Shirley reported she, Mary Jean, Carol and Molly Babcock won their first 2 games but lost the third, eliminating them from the competition. They all felt the draw was not well done. However, all else was great at the bonspiel!

MSWCA - Marcella asks if anyone (especially Candlewicks) would like to purchase pins. She will post list of the organization's purposes for everyone's information.

Empire State Tropies - Marcella noted the Wicks' silver trophies are inventoried and insured at St. Andrews Country Club. Because of their value, they should stay there in a safe case.





President Nadja McKay called the meeting to order at 12:20 pm. Present were Jean MacIntosh, Betty Stienemann, Heather Kenny, Jean Glus, Marita Smith, Jan Conner, Carol Meszaros, Shirley Bruce.

Secretary: Minutes of the previous meeting approved a written.

Treasurer: Jean Glus reported Bonspiel account \$565.73. General Fund \$445.78. Report attached.

Nominations: Betty Steinemann reported proposed slate of officers to be posted. Secretary Marion Cowles, Treasurer Jean Glus, both to remain in office for two years.,

2 Brooms: Heather Kenny reported:

Day session held at Nutmeg—Nutmeg 2 wins, Ardwicks 1 win

Evening session held at Ardsley with Nutmeg hosting—Nutmeg 2 wins, Ardsley 1 win.

Agreed dates for next season 2 Brooms should be set in early fall.

The Wells-Wicks is being curled presently

Shirley Bruce reported a change in USWCA eligibility for the All American—if a club, i.e. day club or evening club, can field three teams, it is eligible to curl in the All American.

There was a discussion re the day to curl next season and it was agreed to poll those attending the closing luncheon.

It was also agreed that, if the day of choice is Tuesday, to consider listing Thursday as a snow day replacement day.

The Ice Breaker, our first session of the season, should only run for 4 weeks, not the six it did this year, and to use the former Westchester Wicks "Ladder" Pins. By cutting down from six to four weeks it will perhaps allow time for a Junior Skip Event.

Agreed to try in the fall to set a date for a "Friendly" with Plainfield and Nutmeg.

Prizes: In absence of Mary Jean Keenan, it was reported that she has ordered the "Ice Breaker" Pins, all other pins on hand, except for Candlewicks and Chris Bertchie to be informed to contact Carol and Mary Jean re same.

Marita suggested a workshop with new members on A) Scoring B) Etiquette, and to work with our long term members to show patience and friendliness to our new members. Maybe workshop should start at the opening lunch with a Question and Answer on rules and etiquette, etc.

Closing Luncheon: Luncheon and Annual meeting set for April 24th, 12 Noon, and this to be preceded by a Board meeting, both at Ardsley Country Club, with each attendee bringing one item for a silent auction. Marion to send out notice, Jan to follow up. To be brought up at the opening luncheon, at the request of the Ardsley Curling Club Board (see New Business) would membership consider an "All Club" dinner for the closing.




