Ardwicks League Rules

1. General

The rules of play of the United States Curling Association shall apply, except to the extent that they are modified by these rules. These rules will apply to all Ardwicks league play at the Ardsley Curling Club.

2. Games

Games shall generally consist of eight ends, except (i) if a skip concedes the game in fewer than eight ends, in which case the score at the end of the last completed end shall be recorded as the final score; or (ii) if the game is tied at the completion of eight ends, in which case the tie-breaking rules will apply. Individual league chairs may determine that certain games in that league shall consist of more or less than eight ends.

Scheduled Matches

All games shall be played at the time scheduled. It is not permitted for skips to agree to change the times of scheduled games. However, in the event that games must be cancelled due to curling facility ice failure, severe weather, or other conditions which prevent games from going forward, the league chair shall arrange for new dates for all such cancelled games.

4. Qualified Rinks

- a. A qualified rink must consist of at least three players, any two of whom must be regular members of the rink. If at least two regular members from the rink are not present for the game, that team forfeits the game.
- b. If a qualified rink consists of three players, each of the first two players shall deliver three stones in an end.
- c. If a qualified rink commences play with three players, and a fourth player (either a regular member or a substitute) joins the game in progress, she may enter at the beginning of any end, and, if that player is a regular member of the team, play in her regular

position, or if that player is a substitute, play in the appropriate position (as discussed under **Section 5** below).

d. If a player is injured during a game and is unable to continue to play, the skip may continue the game with at least three players or may utilize a substitute who shall play in the place of the injured player from the time of the injury.

5. Substitutes

It is encouraged that substitutes be drawn from an official Ardwicks substitute list as applicable to each women's league.

- a. If the skip requires a substitute, she may obtain any substitute to play in the skip position.
 - b. If one substitute is used (other than in a. above), she must play lead.
- c. If two substitutes are used (other than in a. above), they must play lead and second.
- d. A penalty point list of players will be established before the commencement of play consisting of the skip level players in the league, as evaluated by the league chair and the senior skips of that league. A penalty-point person when playing as a substitute (other than in a. above) must play lead. Any substitute from the penalty point list shall cause a one-point penalty if they are the 2nd skip level player on that team. It is not permitted for a rink to utilize two players from the penalty point list as substitutes in any game.

6. Tardiness

If a qualified rink is not present and ready to play within fifteen minutes of the scheduled time for the game, it will be assessed one penalty point and the game shall be reduced from eight ends to seven. The tardy rink shall throw the first stone of the game. One additional penalty point and a reduction of the game by one end will occur for each fifteen minutes thereafter that a qualified rink fails to appear. If the rink is not ready to play within 30 minutes

after the scheduled time, it forfeits the match. If neither rink is present within 30 minutes of the scheduled time, both rinks will be assessed with a loss.

7. Pace of Play

An eight-end game should be completed in about two hours. It is the responsibility of the skips to maintain an appropriate pace to complete play within that time.

8. Tie Games

In the event that a match is tied at the end of eight ends, the following means of breaking the tie will be utilized:

Mini-End - Both teams will play a modified-end in which each player on the team will deliver one stone (rather than two). The team that last scored in the regular match will throw the first stone. If the match remains tied after the completion of the mini-end, the game will be determined by skips' rocks (see below);

Skips' Rocks - The skip or person designated by the skip of the team that last scored in the regular match shall deliver one stone. Regular sweeping rules apply. When the stone has come to rest in the house, its distance from the button shall be measured and the stone removed. Thereafter the skip, or person designated by the skip, of the other team will deliver one stone, with regular sweeping rules applying. The team whose stone comes to rest in the house closest to the button shall win the game. If neither rock is in the house or it is impossible to determine which rock is closest by measuring, the winner of the game will be determined by a coin flip.



Concerns about 5 year and under women's, men's and mixed bonspiels were raised. USCA Women's Challenge in other parts of the country has allowed men on teams when short of women. GNCC (East Coast) has only allowed women. There was discussion of changing the event to be an Open Challenge and including men. Nothing formal has been decided.

Promotional items' (pins, etc.) profits will be used for junior size sliders and brooms. Clubs will be notified that they will be available.

All USWCA curlers are eligible to apply for inclusion in 2006 Scots and Canadian Friendship Tours. Applications will be available this fall with results announced 1 year ahead for proper planning. (A cost of approximately \$2000 per person is anticipated.) Scots Tour lasts 3 weeks, playing once or twice daily. Friendship Tour is for Seniors, lasts 2 weeks and play 1 game per day. Each club may submit 2 applications; only 1 per club will be accepted.

Dues have been raised to \$10 per club plus \$5 per woman.

Jennifer is retiring as Ardwicks representative. However, she continues on as Nutmeg representative.

Jennifer encourages participation of juniors in national competitions - opportunities and funds are there.

USWCA National Bonspiel February, 2005 - Kettle Morain. Jennifer stresses that intent money must be in promptly for bonspiels.

(A cost of approximately \$2000 per person is anticipated.) Scots Tour lasts 3 weeks, playing once or twice daily. Friendship Tour is for Seniors, lasts 2 weeks and play 1 game per day. Each club may submit 2 applications; only 1 per club will be accepted.

Dues have been raised to \$10 per club plus \$5 per woman.

Jennifer is retiring as Ardwicks representative. However, she continues on as Nutmeg representative.

Jennifer encourages participation of juniors in national competitions - opportunities and funds are there.
