Greetings fellow curlers

On October 20, 2019, the board of the Ardsley Curling Club held an open meeting to address the future of the club and answer questions. For those of you that were not in attendance, I would like to fill you in.

At the present time, we are working on extending the lease with the country club. Vicky Vron, Derek Kayser, Mike Shalhoub, and I have been meeting with the president of the country club over the past 10 months and are very close to reaching a final agreement which will allow us to continue curling at our present facility.

Over the past 53 years, the curling club has been fortunate in having a VERY, VERY sweet deal when it came to rent. I am emphasizing this because moving forward things are going to change. What was once easily affordable will become more difficult. One thing is certain. If we are able to extend our lease, next season our rent will see a significant increase. Then over a period of time, the rent will increase to the amount that the country club feels is fair market value for the building. We are looking for this to happen over the span of 10 years.

What does this mean for us?

FIRST, we will be able to continue curling without interruption.

SECOND, and most important, we will need to grow.

We need to gain new members and retain current members.

We need to increase our revenue from outside sources: corporate events, bonspiels, samplers, sponsorships, advertising, and donations.

We will need to, and I don't enjoy saying it, restructure our dues schedule.



THIRD, this calls for a massive effort by EVERYONE. AND I MEAN EVERYONE!!!

A handful of people can not do this alone. You have all heard this before. We are a volunteer organization. That does not mean that it can be left to a few hard working volunteers. That means EVERYONE HAS TO PARTICIPATE.

If you have volunteered in the past, thank you. You know what it takes to get the job done. Your experience is invaluable, and your help is needed once again.

If you have never stepped up, now is your time to shine.



Canada took home the gold from the 40 countries participating: Andorra, Australia, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chinese Taipei, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, England, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Kazakstan, Korea, Kosovo, Latvia, Luxembourg, New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Poland, Russia, Scotland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, USA, and Wales.



Long time curler Jean MacIntosh will turn 100 this year. Jean curled at Saint Andrews before Ardsley had its own ice. She continued curling at Ardsley well into her 90s and retired from the sport only a few years ago.




## Ahoy, Mateys
