The Gordon International Medal

Every year since 1884 (127 years ago), the GNCC competes against the Canadian Branch of The Royal Caledonian Club (curling clubs within a 100 miles of Montreal). The winning side tallies more rocks than the other and each member of the winner gets THE GORDON INTERNATIONAL MEDAL. Well, the GNCC has only accomplished this win in CANADA seven times, 1884, 1904, 1935, 1938, 1942, 1969 and 2011. Our GNCC curler, Jim Holmblad of Schenectady CC won this medal in 1969 and 2011. The last GORDON MEDAL won in the USA was in 1982 and Jim earned that medal too. On March 19, The GNCC, 22 teams, tallied 374 rocks and the Canadian Branch, 44 teams, tallied 356 rocks.

The Gordon bonspiel alternates between Montreal and the GNCC. Next year, it is in UTICA, NY. This men's social competition is "curling with mates who are more concerned about enjoying the game and the people you meet". The first three games a "friendlies" and only the two Saturday game scores


are tallied. The tally is kept secret until the end of the banquet Saturday night which includes cocktail hour, piping in the head table, traditional roast beef dinner. The**MEN'S** City of Ottawa Bonspiel



Back in March 2011, Gert Messing, Mike Murphy, Greg Poole, & Chris Banino competed in the City of Ottawa Bonspiel. The City of Ottawa Bonspiel dates back to February, 1956 when 76 teams competed for eight trophies. After 56 years, the bonspiel now consists of three divisions and 20 events. In 2011, the Open Division (men over 19) had 128 teams, the Senior Division (men over 50) had 34 teams and the Senators Division (men over 65) had 21 teams. We played in the Open Division. The event is unique not only in its size but in how it is set up. Each one of your games is played in a different curling club located somewhere within the city of Ottawa. It's great because teams can meet new people and experience different ice every game while driving and experiencing the capital of Canada.

Due to the size of the event the a team is not penalized if they lose a game early. That is just what we did this year. A loss will drop you down into a second or third event but you can still compete for the Championship of the City. We lost our very first game of the bonspiel and then we went on to win the next seven games. It is a grueling event because we played 9 games in 4 days. It all started on Thursday the 17th at 3:30 in the afternoon. We played 2 games on Thursday and 2 games on Friday and then 3 games on Saturday and 2 on Sunday. By winning the 2nd event we were placed into the Grand Aggregate. The Grand Aggregate takes the winner of the first event, the winner of the second event and the semi finalists of the first event. The teams compete in a final four to determine overall winner of the city if Ottawa Championship. We lost our semi final match of the Grand Aggregate, but it did not put a damper on our weekend. We believe that we were the first American team to win the 2nd event, and we just might have been the first American team to play in the Grand Aggregate final four. The city of Ottawa is a great event and I would encourage anyone to play in it and experience the beautiful city of Ottawa.




