2012 Men's Worlds Championship



To the winner of the USCA Men's Nationals go the spoils. This includes a trip to Switzerland to compete in the Men's World Championship, held the end of March. Unless you were living under a rock you know that they finished strong. Despite dropping some early games they won some big ones down the stretch to finish 8th out of 12. The placement at Worlds is very important. Only 10 countries are selected to compete in the Olympics. The host country gets an automatic bid, leaving 9 more slots to fill. The 7 countries that earn the most combined points at this past event and next year's World Championships earn a trip to the next Olympic Games. The last two teams make it by qualifying at a separate qualifying tournament. By finishing 8th, Men's Team USA is in striking distance of qualifying through total points. Our Women's Team are currently running 5th.

Other spoils for our winners include a guaranteed trip to the US Olympic Trials and significant financial backing by the USCA to continue competing during the following season. Let's all hope Heath McCormick, Bill Stopera, Martin Sather, and Dean Gemmell continue their successful run next year.
