Andrew Stopera is Heading to Junior Nationals

Andrew Stopera, and his team, Team Dunnam won the GNCC Junior Championship last week at the Potomac Curling Club, and are headed to the US Junior National Championships at Broomstones from Jan 26-Feb 2. The other members of his team are Scott Dunnam (Skip - Philadelphia), second Steven Szemple (Plainfield), and lead Andy Dunnam (Philadelphia).

Team Dunnam went undefeated in Potomac competing against 9 teams from all over the northeast. In the final they beat Team McMakin 12-5. Team Dunnam got a great start by scoring 3 in the first end. After giving up 1 in the 2nd they put the game away, scoring 6 in the third end to go up 9-1. Stopera set up the big end with a take out through a small port to lie 4 behind cover. Stopera said "They tried to put up a guard but it just didn't curl enough and they left us an opening. Fortunately I was able to get the rock through the port."

After the game Stopera said "it feels great, I didn't really think I would be going to Nationals this soon, but I am really excited."

Their skip is from Nutmeg, with representation from Schenectady and Nashua, They ended the round robin in a three way tie for the last spot in the playoffs. The Suslavich Rink was forced to play three matches in the same day to qualify, but dropped the last of three to fall just short of the playoff round.
